Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize the continued participation in the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) and authorize the Interim Village Manager or her designee to accept a contract with the lowest cost electricity provider.

Discussion

On December 6, 2006, the Village of Hanover Park selected the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) to serve as the Village’s broker relative to the acquisition of electrical energy. NIMEC is an experienced energy broker, and their municipal collaborative has approximately 140 members. This pool allows NIMEC’s members to secure more competitive pricing based on higher volumes than can be provided to a single municipality.

In 2023, the Village entered a 36-month contract with NIMEC to be a part of a bid process to provide electrical power for standard large stable accounts to Villages, such as lift stations, pumping stations, and Metra stations, from May 2023 through May 2026. The Village also entered a 36-month contract with NIMEC to be a part of a bid process to provide electrical power for streetlights accounts to Villages from July 2023 through July 2026.

NIMEC offers 12- to 36-month pricing. Each member is able to select the term which best meets their individual needs.

Because of the way the bidding process works, the Interim Village Manager or her designee seeks authority to sign a contract with the lowest cost electricity provider on the same day that the bid is received by NIMEC, on or before March 11, 2026 for the Village’s standard large stable account, and on or before May 06, 2026 for the Village’s streetlights.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE
NORTHERN ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC COLABORATIVE (NIMEC)
AND AUTHORIZING THE INTERIM VILLAGE MANAGER OR HER
DESIGNEE TO APPROVE CONTRACTS WITH THE MOST FAVORABLE
ELECTRICITY PROVIDER FOR THE VILLAGE**

WHEREAS, on January 2, 2007, the State of Illinois implemented a plan to deregulate Commonwealth Edison; and

WHEREAS, under the aforementioned deregulation plan, Commonwealth Edison no longer generates electricity for its customers, but continues to provide electric power through its distribution system; and

WHEREAS, as a result of this deregulation, electricity is purchased based on market price, and Exelon, the parent company of Commonwealth Edison, is no longer the sole supplier of electricity in northern Illinois, resulting in new electricity suppliers competing against Exelon, and competitive market forces dictating the price of electricity; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hanover Park selected the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) on December 6, 2006 to serve as the Village's broker relative to the acquisition of electrical energy due to NIMEC'S municipal experience and the fact that NIMEC is a municipal collaborative which will be pooling the energy needs of members of the collaborative in order to secure more competitive pricing based on higher volumes than can be provided individually to a single municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Interim Village Manager or her designee will need to have the authority to sign a new contract with the electricity provider which is deemed most favorable for the Village within hours of the bids being received by NIMEC on or before March 11, 2026 for standard large stable such as lift stations and pumping stations and on or before May 06, 2026 for Village's streetlights; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hanover Park, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) is hereby appointed as the Village's broker for purposes of obtaining a supply of electricity for the Village's municipal needs, and the Interim Village Manager or her designee is hereby directed to take all actions necessary to establish said broker relationship.

SECTION 2: That the Interim Village Manager or her designee is authorized to discuss and negotiate energy rates directly with suppliers in an effort to secure a lower energy cost for the Village of Hanover Park.

SECTION 3: That in light of the time constraints applicable to the acceptance of a competitive bid for a supply of electricity, once the bids are received by NIMEC, the Interim Village Manager or her designee is hereby authorized to sign the contract with the lowest responsible bidder.

SECTION 4: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after this resolution's passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting to amend the 2025 purchase order with H&H Electric Company, Inc. for the annual streetlight maintenance contract. The original approved purchase order was for \$175,000. An additional \$34,000 is needed to cover the costs that were necessary to maintain the streetlights in 2025.

Discussion

The Village owns approximately 1,200 streetlights that require periodic maintenance as well as emergency response to knocked-down poles. Additionally, maintenance is required on other lights owned by the Village (e.g., municipal campus lots, wastewater treatment plant, lift stations, and Metra commuter parking lot). On December 19, 2024, the Village Board approved a purchase order for \$175,000 for the FY2025 Streetlight Maintenance. The majority of the work is related to streetlights that are out and call-outs for knocked-down poles. The costs of knockdowns are often eventually recouped through insurance claims. Due to the higher-than-anticipated number of streetlight repairs in 2025, the PO requires the addition of \$34,000 to cover the costs.

While the 2025 Budget only included \$175,000 for annual streetlight maintenance, several other projects in that same fund came in under budget. Below is a summary of projects in that fund. Staff recommends using those cost savings to pay for these streetlight costs.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees pass a Resolution authorizing a Proposal between the Village of Hanover Park and Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc. for environmental mosquito management in Wayne Township.

Discussion

Historically, the Village has entered into agreements with Wayne Township for mosquito abatement, wherein the Village contributed 90 percent of the spraying costs within the Hanover Park portion of Wayne Township. The previous contract with Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management expired at the end of 2025. A new four-year proposal has been submitted by Clarke to cover mosquito abatement services in the Wayne Township areas of Bartlett, Carol Stream, Hanover Park, Wayne, and Wayne Township. The proposal details costs broken down by individual community.

Clarke's proposed cost for Hanover Park is \$28,840. Under the proposed cost-sharing structure, the Village will be responsible for \$25,956, with Wayne Township contributing \$2,884. Wayne Township has accepted Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management's proposal and awarded them the contract for a four-year period, ending in 2029. The cost to the Village is \$25,956 annually. This amount represents a 3% increase from the previous contract's annual cost. A projected increase of 3% or less is anticipated for the subsequent four-year agreement, which will be based on the current Consumer Price Index (CPI).

FOR MOSQUITO ABATEMENT SERVICES**

WHEREAS, Wayne Township, located in DuPage County, Illinois, a unit of local government as established under the laws of the State of Illinois and hereinafter referred to as the “Township”; and the Village of Hanover Park located in DuPage County, Illinois, a municipality as established under the laws of the State of Illinois and hereinafter referred to as the “Village”, as units of local government, wish to cooperate in providing mosquito control benefits to the inhabitants of their respective units of local government; and

WHEREAS, in order for both parties to benefit in the economies of large-scale mosquito abatement programs Township and Village desire to share the expense of abatement services as Township and Village have done previously together with other municipalities located in the Township; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the Village is located within Wayne Township so that effective mosquito abatement for each is possible only if the adjoining areas within the other are effectively treated; and

WHEREAS, the contractor who will provide the service to Township and Village, as well as other municipalities located in the Township, is Clarke Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc., and it has proposed a four (4) year agreement (2026 – 2029) for which Village shall pay \$103,824 or \$25,956 per year and Township shall pay \$11,536 or \$2,884 per year in four (4) monthly installments per year, which proposal Village finds to be in the best interest of the Village; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hanover Park, Illinois, that the Village President is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Village of Hanover Park to execute an Agreement between Clark Environmental Mosquito Management, Inc. and the Village for mosquito abatement services in the form attached hereto and made a part hereof.

 - 1. Larval Control: Stocking of 1,500 mosquito fish (*Gambusia affinis*) for biological control.
 - 2. Helicopter Prehatch: Two (2) treatments using a 30 day residual product of 12 acres.
 - 3. Catch Basins:
 - a. One (1) treatment of up to 762 street side catch basins, inlets and manholes using a sustained release insecticide for control of up to 150 days.
 - b. One (1) treatment of up to 762 street side catch basins, inlets and manholes using an extended residual slow release insecticide for control of up to 30 days.
 - c. Treatment of up to 10 backyard catch basins using an extended residual slow release insecticide for up to 150 day control.

**Part IV. Adult Control**

- A. Adulthooding in mosquito harborage areas:
 - 1. Six (6) scheduled truck/ATV Ultra Low Volume (ULV) treatments using a synthetic pyrethroid insecticide for July 4th event or any community special events of up to 1.5 miles.
- B. Adulthooding in Residential Areas:
 - 1. Eight (8) community-wide truck ULV treatments of up to 42.1 miles of streets using Biomist® or synthetic pyrethroid insecticide.
- C. Adulthooding Operational Procedures
 - 1. Notification of community contact.
 - 2. Weather limit monitoring and compliance.

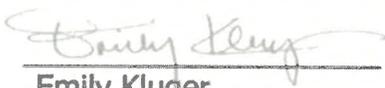

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize the approval of the annual Neptune 360 Software Hosting Fee with Ferguson Waterworks to provide a data management platform monitoring water consumption of all Village customers in the amount of \$31,098.24.

Discussion

The Village utilizes a cloud-based Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) software system to manage water usage data and ensure accurate utility billing. Since its implementation in 2021, following the Village-wide water meter replacement project, this platform has served as a critical interface for translating meter readings into actionable financial and operational data. Beyond basic billing functions, the system provides high-resolution insights into individual accounts, allowing staff to identify peak usage periods, detect potential leaks, such as running toilets, and monitor for instances of reverse flow or meter tampering.

Maintaining this software is a vital component of the Finance Department's customer service efforts. By having access to real-time data and historical usage trends, staff can provide residents with detailed explanations regarding their water consumption, including any activity that might otherwise lead to costly bills or property damage. This level of transparency fosters improved communication between the Village and its customers while ensuring the integrity of the water distribution system.

The annual hosting and service fee is calculated based on the total number of meters maintained within the database. The Fiscal Year 2026 Budget includes \$31,161 to cover these ongoing costs. Given that this system is integral to the Village's revenue collection and customer support operations, staff recommends the Village Board authorize the continued use and funding of this cloud-based hosting service for the current fiscal year.

Discussion

During the design stage, geotechnical and soil testing help set clear specifications for soil compaction, material disposal, and roadway base design. By following these thorough standards, the Village can reduce future maintenance issues and improve the overall performance of its infrastructure investments.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize the purchase of two (2) additional column lifts from Mohawk Lifts, LLC. of Amsterdam, New York, in the amount of \$35,088.

Discussion

The Village's Fleet Division currently utilizes a four-column mobile lift system to perform essential maintenance on heavy-duty vehicles, a configuration that successfully replaced an outdated and failed in-ground lift system in 2020. While the current equipment has a lifting capacity of 80,000 pounds, it is insufficient for the Village's four largest vehicles, which exceed that threshold. To address this operational limitation, staff is requesting the purchase of two additional columns to work in conjunction with the existing set. The addition of these columns will increase the total lifting capacity to 112,000 pounds, ensuring that all Village fleet vehicles can be serviced safely and effectively in-house.

The Mohawk brand was originally selected for its industry-leading safety ratings and heavy-duty construction, making it the most reliable option among competing brands. By adding two compatible units, the Fleet Division will be equipped to elevate the Village's largest fire engines and sewer jetting trucks to a height that allows mechanics to perform repairs while standing. This ergonomic improvement is a critical safety consideration, as it eliminates the need for staff to perform complex mechanical work while lying on their backs, thereby reducing the risk of workplace injuries and improving overall maintenance efficiency.

This equipment purchase is included in the Fiscal Year 2026 Budget. The addition of these units is essential for maintaining the Village's heavy-duty assets while upholding the highest standards of employee safety and operational readiness. Staff recommends that the Village Board authorize the establishment of a purchase order for the acquisition of these two additional mobile column lifts.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize the approval of the purchase of a replacement anti-icing unit from Henderson Products Sales of Huntley, Illinois, for an amount not to exceed \$27,272.

Discussion

The Village's current anti-icing unit was acquired in 2013. This equipment is essential for pre-treating Hanover Park streets with a specialized salt-brine and beet juice mixture, a process that is highly effective at preventing snow and ice from bonding to the pavement during winter weather events. With its 1,000-gallon capacity, this truck-mounted system allows staff to treat approximately 20 percent of the Village's street network in a single trip. Beyond its primary winter operations, the unit provides year-round utility by supporting landscaping and tree-watering efforts during the summer months. However, after over a decade of heavy use, the equipment is becoming increasingly unreliable, necessitating a replacement to ensure the Village maintains its operational readiness.

Staff recommends the purchase of a 2026 Liquid Application System from Henderson Products, located in Huntley, Illinois. The replacement unit will be a fully self-contained system, including the tank, valves, pump, and spray bars, designed for mounting in the bed of a backup International 7400 plow truck. By utilizing Henderson Products through the National Purchasing Partners (NPP) cooperative, the Village is able to leverage a pre-negotiated contract that ensures competitive pricing while streamlining the procurement process. Placing the order at this time will facilitate an expected delivery in the second quarter of 2026, providing ample time for setup and training before the upcoming winter season.

The total cost for the new anti-icing unit is \$27,272. Although this exceeds the initial budget allocation of \$27,000 by \$272, the minor overage will be covered by cost savings realized from the under-budget purchase of a message board within the same account. Upon the delivery and commissioning of the new system, the 2013 unit will be decommissioned and

disassembled to provide a stock of spare parts for the remaining fleet, further extending the value of the original asset. Based on the equipment’s critical role in public safety and the available funding, staff recommends that the Village Board authorize the establishment of a purchase order for this replacement.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize a purchase order to ABC Mechanical in the amount of \$27,112.33 for the rebuild of a Return Activated Sludge Pump at the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP).

Discussion

The Return Activated Sludge (RAS) pump serves as a critical mechanical component of the Village's wastewater treatment infrastructure, essential for maintaining the biological health and operational stability of the treatment plant. Return Activated Sludge consists of the concentrated beneficial microorganisms, or biomass, that have already treated the wastewater and settled to the bottom of the secondary clarifiers. The RAS pump continuously recirculates settled sludge back to the aeration basins at the start of the treatment process. This loop is vital because it ensures that a consistent and adequate population of microorganisms is always present to break down organic matter in the incoming raw sewage. Without this constant replenishment of "activated" sludge, the biological process would become depleted, severely compromising the plant's ability to treat waste.

Beyond its mechanical function, the RAS pump is fundamental to the Village's ability to meet stringent environmental and regulatory requirements. By maintaining a stable and controlled biological environment, the pump prevents treatment disruptions that could lead to non-compliance with discharge permits. This stability protects local waterways and ensures public health by maintaining the integrity of the treatment cycle. Because the sewer treatment plant cannot operate effectively or reliably without a functional RAS system, the redundancy and reliability of these pumps are of the highest priority.

Staff is recommending the authorization to rebuild an existing RAS pump as part of the Village's ongoing equipment lifecycle management. This repair will extend the life of an aging unit that has reached the end of its reliable service life, ensuring the wastewater treatment facility remains resilient and able to meet the Village's utility needs without interruption. Based on the critical nature of this equipment to the plant's biological process and the

necessity of maintaining regulatory standards, staff recommends that the Board approve the rebuilding of the RAS pump by ABC Mechanical. The last quote received for the purchase of a new RAS pump was approximately \$60,000. Rebuilding the pump at this point would substantially extend its lifespan and is a more effective use of public funds. The FY2026 Budget includes \$50,000 for process pump replacements and repairs.

Recommended Action

Motion to authorize a purchase order to ABC Mechanical in the amount of \$27,112.33 for the rebuild of a Return Activated Sludge Pump at STP and authorize the Interim Village Manager to execute the necessary documents.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees authorize the proposal from Trane U.S. Inc in the amount not to exceed \$374,600.00 for the replacement of the Police Department boilers.

Discussion

The Fiscal Year 2026 Budget includes an allocation of \$375,000 for the replacement of three (3) boilers at the Police Headquarters. These units have exceeded their projected service life and have experienced persistent mechanical failures over several years, with one unit currently non-operational. Located on the second floor of the facility, these boilers provide the sole source of hot water heating for the entire Police Department. Ensuring their reliable operation is critical to maintaining a functional environment for 24-hour public safety operations and preventing potential system-wide failures during peak heating months.

To ensure cost-effectiveness and project efficiency, staff solicited pricing through Trane, a leading HVAC manufacturer and a recognized vendor within the Omnia National Purchasing Cooperative (ONPC). As a member of this cooperative, the Village is able to leverage national contract pricing to reduce service costs and streamline the procurement process while meeting competitive standards. ONPC has identified Hartwig Mechanical as the preferred contractor to perform the specialized mechanical work required for this installation under this cooperative agreement.

Hartwig Mechanical has an established and successful history of performing large-scale HVAC and boiler replacements for the Village, including projects at Fire Station #15, the Public Works facility, and the installation of rooftop units at Village Hall. Their familiarity with Village infrastructure and proven track record of performance provides high confidence in the successful completion of this project. Given the critical nature of the heating system and the

In no event will prices be decreased.
5. **Exclusions from Work.** Company's obligation is limited to the Work as defined and does not include any modifications to the Work site under the Americans With Disabilities Act or any other law or building code(s). In no event shall Company be required to perform work Company reasonably believes is outside of the defined Work without a written change order signed by Customer and Company.
6. **Performance.** Company shall perform the Work in accordance with industry standards generally applicable in the area under similar circumstances as of the time Company performs the Work. Company may refuse to perform any Work where working conditions could endanger property or put at risk the safety of persons. Unless otherwise agreed to by Customer and Company, at Customer's expense and before the Work begins, Customer will provide any necessary access platforms, catwalks to safely perform the Work in compliance with OSHA or state industrial safety regulations.
7. **Payment.** Customer shall pay Company's invoices within net 30 days of invoice date. Company also is not liable for any claims, damages, losses, or expenses, arising from or related to work done by or services provided by individuals or entities that are not employed by or hired by Company.

15. Asbestos and Hazardous Materials. Company's Work and other services in connection with this Agreement expressly excludes any identification, abatement, cleanup, control, disposal, removal or other work connected with asbestos, polychlorinated biphenyl ("PCB"), or other hazardous materials (hereinafter, collectively, "Hazardous Materials"). Customer warrants and represents that, except as set forth in a writing signed by Company, there are no Hazardous Materials on the Work site that will in any way affect Company's Work and Customer has disclosed to Company the existence and location of any Hazardous Materials in all areas within which Company will be performing the Work. Should Company become aware of or suspect the presence of Hazardous Materials, Company may immediately stop work in the affected area and shall notify Customer. Customer will be exclusively responsible for taking any and all action necessary to correct the condition in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. Customer shall be exclusively responsible for and, to the fullest extent permitted by law, shall indemnify and hold harmless Company (including its employees, agents and subcontractors) from and against any loss, claim, liability, fees, penalties, injury (including death) or liability of any nature, and the payment thereof arising out of or relating to any Hazardous Materials on or about the Work site, not brought onto the Work site by Company. Company shall be required to resume performance of the Work in the affected area only in the absence of Hazardous Materials or when the affected area has been rendered harmless. In no event shall Company be obligated to transport or handle Hazardous Materials, provide any notices to any governmental agency, or examine the Work site for the presence of Hazardous Materials.

16. Force Majeure. Company's duty to perform under this Agreement is contingent upon the non-occurrence of an Event of Force Majeure. If Company shall be unable to carry out any material obligation under this Agreement due to an Event of Force Majeure, this Agreement shall at Company's election (i) remain in effect but Company's obligations shall be suspended until the uncontrollable event terminates or (ii) be terminated upon 10 days' notice to Customer, in which event Customer shall pay Company for all parts of the Work furnished to the date of termination. An "Event of Force Majeure" shall mean any cause or event beyond the control of Company. Without limiting the foregoing, "Event of Force Majeure" includes: acts of God; acts of terrorism, war or the public enemy; flood; earthquake; tornado; storm; fire; civil disobedience; pandemic insurrections; riots; labor/labour disputes; labor/labour or material shortages; sabotage; restraint by court order or public authority (whether valid or invalid), and action or non-action by or inability to obtain or keep in force the necessary governmental authorizations, permits, licenses, certificates or approvals if not caused by Company; and the requirements of any applicable government in any manner that diverts either the material or the finished product to the direct or indirect benefit of the government.

17. Customer's Breach. Each of the following events or conditions shall constitute a breach by Customer and shall give Company the right, without an election of remedies, to terminate this Agreement or suspend performance by delivery of written notice: (1) Any failure by Customer to pay amounts when due; or (2) any general assignment by Customer for the benefit of its creditors, or if Customer becomes bankrupt or insolvent or takes the benefit of any statute for bankrupt or insolvent debtors, or makes or proposes to make any proposal or arrangement with creditors, or if any steps are taken for the winding up or other termination of Customer or the liquidation of its assets, or if a trustee, receiver, or similar person is appointed over any of the assets or interests of Customer; (3) Any representation or warranty furnished by Customer in this Agreement is false or misleading in any material respect when made; or (4) Any failure by Customer to perform or comply with any material provision of this Agreement. Customer shall be liable to Company for all Work furnished to date and all damages sustained by Company (including lost profit and overhead)

18. Indemnity. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Company and Customer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless each other from any and all claims, actions, costs, expenses, damages and liabilities, including reasonable attorneys' fees, resulting from death or bodily injury or damage to real or tangible personal property, to the extent caused by the negligence or misconduct of their respective employees or other authorized agents in connection with their activities within the scope of this Agreement. Neither party shall indemnify the other against claims, damages, expenses or liabilities to the extent attributable to the acts or omissions of the other party. If the parties are both at fault, the obligation to indemnify shall be proportional to their relative fault. The duty to indemnify will continue in full force and effect, notwithstanding the expiration or early termination hereof, with respect to any claims based on facts or conditions that occurred prior to expiration or termination.

19. Limitation of Liability. **NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING TO THE CONTRARY, IN NO EVENT SHALL COMPANY BE LIABLE FOR ANY SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT CONSEQUENTIAL, OR PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES (INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION BUSINESS INTERRUPTION, LOST DATA, LOST REVENUE, LOST PROFITS, LOST DOLLAR SAVINGS, OR LOST ENERGY USE SAVINGS, INCLUDING CONTAMINANTS LIABILITIES, EVEN IF A PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF SUCH POSSIBLE DAMAGES OR IF SAME WERE REASONABLY FORESEEABLE AND REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE CAUSE OF ACTION IS FRAMED IN CONTRACT, NEGLIGENCE, ANY OTHER TORT, WARRANTY, STRICT LIABILITY, OR PRODUCT LIABILITY).** In no event will Company's liability in connection with the provision of products or services or otherwise under this Agreement exceed the entire amount paid to Company by Customer under this Agreement.

20. CONTAMINANTS LIABILITY

The transmission of COVID-19 may occur in a variety of ways and circumstances, many of the aspects of which are currently not known. HVAC systems, products, services and other offerings have not been tested for their effectiveness in reducing the spread of COVID-19, including through the air in closed environments. **IN NO EVENT WILL COMPANY BE LIABLE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR OTHERWISE FOR ANY INDEMNIFICATION, ACTION OR CLAIM, WHETHER BASED ON WARRANTY, CONTRACT, TORT OR OTHERWISE, FOR ANY BODILY INJURY (INCLUDING DEATH), DAMAGE TO PROPERTY, OR ANY OTHER LIABILITIES, DAMAGES OR COSTS RELATED TO CONTAMINANTS (INCLUDING THE SPREAD, TRANSMISSION, MITIGATION, ELIMINATION, OR CONTAMINATION THEREOF) (COLLECTIVELY, "CONTAMINANT LIABILITIES") AND CUSTOMER HEREBY EXPRESSLY RELEASES COMPANY FROM ANY SUCH CONTAMINANTS LIABILITIES.**

21. Patent Indemnity. Company shall protect and indemnify Customer from and against all claims, damages, judgments and loss arising from infringement or alleged infringement of any United States patent by any of the goods manufactured by Company and delivered hereunder, provided that in the event of suit or threat of suit for patent infringement, Company shall promptly be notified and given full opportunity to negotiate a settlement. Company does not warrant against infringement by reason of Customer's design of the articles or the use thereof in combination with other materials or in the operation of any process. In the event of litigation, Customer agrees to reasonably cooperate with Company. In connection with any proceeding under the provisions of this Section, all parties concerned shall be entitled to be represented by counsel at their own expense.

22. Limited Warranty. Company warrants for a period of 12 months from the date of substantial completion ("Warranty Period") commercial equipment manufactured and installed by Company against failure due to defects in material and manufacture and that the labor/labour furnished is warranted to have been properly performed (the "Limited Warranty"). Trane equipment sold on an uninstalled basis is warranted in accordance with Company's standard warranty for supplied equipment. **Product manufactured by Company that includes required startup and is sold in North America will not be warranted by Company unless Company performs the product start-up.** Substantial completion shall be the earlier of the date that the Work is sufficiently complete so that the Work can be utilized for its intended use or the date that Customer receives beneficial use of the Work. If such defect is discovered within the Warranty Period, Company will correct the defect or furnish replacement equipment (or, at its option, parts therefor) and, if said equipment was installed pursuant hereto, labor/labour associated with the replacement of parts or equipment not conforming to this Limited Warranty. Defects must be reported to Company within the Warranty Period. Exclusions from this Limited Warranty include damage or failure arising from: wear and tear; corrosion, erosion, deterioration; Customer's failure to follow the Company-provided maintenance plan; refrigerant not supplied by Company; and modifications made by others to Company's equipment. Company shall not be obligated to pay for the cost of lost refrigerant. Notwithstanding the foregoing, all warranties provided herein terminate upon termination or cancellation of this Agreement. No warranty liability whatsoever shall attach to Company until the Work has been paid for in full and then said liability shall be limited to the lesser of Company's cost to correct the defective Work and/or the purchase price of the equipment shown to be defective. Equipment, material and/or parts that are not manufactured by Company ("Third-Party Product(s)") are not warranted by Company and have such warranties as may be extended by the respective manufacturer. **CUSTOMER UNDERSTANDS THAT COMPANY IS NOT THE MANUFACTURER OF ANY THIRD-PARTY PRODUCT(S) AND ANY WARRANTIES, CLAIMS, STATEMENTS, REPRESENTATIONS, OR SPECIFICATIONS ARE THOSE OF THE THIRD-PARTY MANUFACTURER, NOT COMPANY AND CUSTOMER IS NOT RELYING ON ANY WARRANTIES, CLAIMS, STATEMENTS, REPRESENTATIONS, OR SPECIFICATIONS REGARDING THE THIRD-PARTY PRODUCT THAT MAY BE PROVIDED BY COMPANY OR ITS AFFILIATES, WHETHER ORAL OR WRITTEN. THE WARRANTY AND LIABILITY SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT ARE IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES AND LIABILITIES, WHETHER IN CONTRACT OR IN NEGLIGENCE, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, IN LAW OR IN FACT, INCLUDING IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE AND/OR OTHERS ARISING FROM COURSE OF DEALING OR TRADE. COMPANY MAKES NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR PARTICULAR PURPOSE. ADDITIONALLY, COMPANY MAKES NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY OF ANY KIND REGARDING PREVENTING, ELIMINATING, REDUCING OR INHIBITING ANY MOLD, FUNGUS, BACTERIA, VIRUS, MICROBIAL GROWTH, OR ANY OTHER CONTAMINANTS (INCLUDING COVID-19 OR ANY SIMILAR VIRUS) (COLLECTIVELY, "CONTAMINANTS"), WHETHER INVOLVING OR IN CONNECTION WITH EQUIPMENT, ANY COMPONENT THEREOF, SERVICES OR OTHERWISE. IN NO EVENT SHALL COMPANY HAVE ANY LIABILITY FOR THE PREVENTION, ELIMINATION, REDUCTION OR INHIBITION OF THE GROWTH OR SPREAD OF SUCH CONTAMINANTS INVOLVING OR IN CONNECTION WITH ANY EQUIPMENT, THIRD-PARTY PRODUCT, OR ANY COMPONENT THEREOF, SERVICES OR OTHERWISE AND CUSTOMER HEREBY SPECIFICALLY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THERETO.**

23. Insurance. Company agrees to maintain the following insurance while the Work is being performed with limits not less than shown below and will, upon request from Customer, provide a Certificate of evidencing the following coverage:

Commercial General Liability	\$2,000,000 per occurrence
Automobile Liability	\$2,000,000 CSL

Workers Compensation Statutory Limits

If Customer has requested to be named as an additional insured under Company's insurance policy, Company will do so but only subject to Company's manuscript additional insured endorsement under its primary Commercial General Liability policies. In no event does Company waive its right of subrogation.

24. Commencement of Statutory Limitation Period. Except as to warranty claims, as may be applicable, any applicable statutes of limitation for acts or failures to act shall commence to run, and any alleged cause of action stemming therefrom shall be deemed to have accrued, in any and all events not later than the last date that Company or its subcontractors physically performed work on the project site.

25. General. Except as provided below, to the maximum extent provided by law, this Agreement is made and shall be interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the state or province in which the Work is performed, without regard to choice of law principles which might otherwise call for the application of a different state's or province's law. Any dispute arising under or relating to this Agreement that is not disposed of by agreement shall be decided by litigation in a court of competent jurisdiction located in the state or province in which the Work is performed. To the extent the Work site is owned and/or operated by any agency of the Federal Government, determination of any substantive issue of law shall be according to the Federal common law of Government contracts as enunciated and applied by Federal judicial bodies and boards of contract appeals of the Federal Government. This Agreement contains all of the agreements, representations and understandings of the parties and supersedes all previous understandings, commitments or agreements, oral or written, related to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be amended, modified or terminated except by a writing signed by the parties hereto. No documents shall be incorporated herein by reference except to the extent Company is a signatory thereon. If any term or condition of this Agreement is invalid, illegal or incapable of being enforced by any rule of law, all other terms and conditions of this Agreement will nevertheless remain in full force and effect as long as the economic or legal substance of the transaction contemplated hereby is not affected in a manner adverse to any party hereto. Customer may not assign, transfer, or convey this Agreement, or any part hereof, or its right, title or interest herein, without the written consent of the Company. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of Customer's permitted successors and assigns. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which when executed shall be deemed to be an original, but all together shall constitute but one and the same Agreement. A fully executed facsimile copy hereof or the several counterparts shall suffice as an original.

26. Federal Requirements. The Parties shall comply with all United States federal labor law obligations under 29 CFR part 471, appendix A to subpart A. THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS ARE INCORPORATED HEREIN BY REFERENCE: Executive Order 11701 and 41 CFR §§ 60-250.5(a), 60-300.5; Executive Order 11758 and 41 CFR § 60-741.5(a); U.S. immigration laws, including the L-1 Visa Reform Act of 2004 and the H-1B Visa Reform Act of 2004; and Executive Order 13496. The Parties shall abide by the requirements of 41 CFR 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a). These regulations prohibit discrimination against qualified individuals based on their status as protected veterans or individuals with disabilities. Moreover, these regulations require that covered prime contractors and subcontractors take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment individuals without regard to protected veteran status or disability. The Parties certify that they do not operate any programs promoting DEI that violate any applicable United States anti-discrimination laws and acknowledge and agree that their compliance with all applicable federal anti-discrimination laws is material to the federal government's payment decisions. The Parties acknowledge and agree that their employment, procurement, and contracting practices shall not consider race, color, sex, sexual preference, religion, or national origin in ways that violate United States federal civil rights laws.

27. Export Laws. The obligation of Company to supply Equipment and/or Services under this Agreement is subject to the ability of Company to supply such items consistent with applicable laws and regulations of the United States and other governments. Company reserves the right to refuse to enter into or perform any order, and to cancel any order, under this Agreement if Company in its sole discretion determines that performance of the transaction to which such order relates would violate any such applicable law or regulation. Customer will pay all handling and other similar costs from Company's factories including the costs of freight, insurance, export clearances, import duties and taxes. Customer will be "exporter of record" with respect to any export from the United States of America and will perform all compliance and logistics functions in connection therewith and will also comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations. Customer understands that Company and/or the Equipment and/or Services are subject to laws and regulations of the United States of America which may require licensing or authorization for and/or prohibit export, re-export or diversion of Company's Equipment and/or Services to certain countries, and agrees it will not knowingly assist or participate in any such diversion or other violation of applicable United States of America laws and regulations. Customer agrees to hold harmless and indemnify Company for any damages resulting to Customer or Company from a breach of this paragraph by Customer.

28. U.S. Government Work.

The following provision applies only to direct sales by Company to the US Government. The Parties acknowledge that all items or services ordered and delivered under this Agreement are Commercial Items as defined under Part 12 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR). In particular, Company agrees to be bound only by those Federal contracting clauses that apply to "commercial" suppliers and that are contained in FAR 52.212-5(e)(1). Company complies with 52.219-8 or 52.219-9 in its service and installation contracting business.

The following provision applies only to indirect sales by Company to the US Government. As a Commercial Item Subcontractor, Company accepts only the following mandatory flow down provisions in effect as of the date of this subcontract: 52.203-19; 52.204-21; 52.204-23; 52.219-8; 52.222-21; 52.222-26; 52.222-35; 52.222-36; 52.222-50; 52.225-26; 52.247-64. If the Work is in connection with a U.S. Government contract, Customer certifies that it has provided and will provide current, accurate, and complete information, representations and certifications to all government officials, including but not limited to the contracting officer and officials of the Small Business Administration, on all matters related to the prime contract, including but not limited to all aspects of its ownership, eligibility, and performance. Anything herein notwithstanding, Company will have no obligations to Customer unless and until Customer provides Company with a true, correct and complete executed copy of the prime contract. Upon request, Customer will provide copies to Company of all requested written communications with any government official related to the prime contract prior to or concurrent with the execution thereof, including but not limited to any communications related to Customer's ownership, eligibility or performance of the prime contract. Customer will obtain written authorization and approval from Company prior to providing any government official any information about Company's performance of the work that is the subject of the Proposal or this Agreement, other than the Proposal or this Agreement.

29. Limited Waiver of Sovereign Immunity. If Customer is an Indian tribe (in the U.S.) or a First Nation or Band Council (in Canada), Customer, whether acting in its capacity as a government, governmental entity, a duly organized corporate entity or otherwise, for itself and for its agents, successors, and assigns: (1) hereby provides this limited waiver of its sovereign immunity as to any damages, claims, lawsuit, or cause of action (herein "Action") brought against Customer by Company and arising or alleged to arise out of the furnishing by Company of any product or service under this Agreement, whether such Action is based in contract, tort, strict liability, civil liability or any other legal theory; (2) agrees that jurisdiction and venue for any such Action shall be proper and valid (a) if Customer is in the U.S., in any state or United States court located in the state in which Company is performing this Agreement or (b) if Customer is in Canada, in the superior court of the province or territory in which the work was performed; (3) expressly consents to such Action, and waives any objection to jurisdiction or venue; (4) waives any requirement of exhaustion of tribal court or administrative remedies for any Action arising out of or related to this Agreement; and (5) expressly acknowledges and agrees that Company is not subject to the jurisdiction of Customer's tribal court or any similar tribal forum, that Customer will not bring any action against Company in tribal court, and that Customer will not avail itself of any ruling or direction of the tribal court permitting or directing it to suspend its payment or other obligations under this Agreement. The individual signing on behalf of Customer warrants and represents that such individual is duly authorized to provide this waiver and enter into this Agreement and that this Agreement constitutes the valid and legally binding obligation of Customer, enforceable in accordance with its terms.

30. Building Automation Systems and Network Security. Customer and Trane acknowledge that Building Automation System (BAS) and connected networks security requires Customer and Trane to maintain certain cybersecurity obligations. Customer acknowledges that upon completion of installation and configuration of the BAS, the Customer maintains ownership of the BAS and the connected network equipment. Except for any applicable warranty obligations, Customer is solely responsible for the maintenance and security of the BAS and related networks and systems. In the event there is a service agreement between Trane and Customer, Trane will provide the services as set forth in the service agreement.

In order to maintain a minimum level of security for the BAS, associated networks, network equipment and systems, Customer's cybersecurity responsibilities include without limitation:

1. Ensure that the BAS, networks, and network equipment are physically secure and not accessible to unauthorized personnel.
2. Ensure the BAS remains behind a secure firewall and properly segmented from all other customer networks and systems, especially those with sensitive information.
3. Keep all Inbound ports closed to any IP Addresses in the BAS.
4. Remove all forwarded inbound ports and IP Addresses to the BAS.
5. Maintain user login credentials and unique passwords, including the use of strong passwords and the removal of access for users who no longer require access.
6. Where remote access is desired, utilize a secure method such as Trane Connect Secure Remote Access or your own VPN.
7. For any Trane services requiring remote data transfer and/or remote user access, configure the BAS and related firewall(s) per instructions provided by Trane. This typically includes configuring Port 443 and associated firewall(s) for Outbound only.
8. Perform regular system maintenance to ensure that your BAS is properly secured, including regular software updates to your BAS and related network equipment (i.e., firewalls).

Any and all claims, actions, losses, expenses, costs, damages, or liabilities of any nature due to Customer's failure to maintain BAS security responsibilities and/or industry standards for cybersecurity are the sole responsibility of the Customer.

SECURITY ADDENDUM

This Addendum shall be applicable to the sale, installation and use of Trane equipment and the sale and provision of Trane services. "Trane" shall mean Trane U.S. Inc. for sales and services in the United States, or Trane Canada ULC for sales and services in Canada.

1. **Definitions.** All terms used in this Addendum shall have the meaning specified in the Agreement unless otherwise defined herein. For the purposes of this Addendum, the following terms are defined as follows:

"**Customer Data**" means Customer account information as related to the Services only and does not include HVAC Machine Data or personal data. Trane does not require, nor shall Customer provide personal data to Trane under the Agreement. Such data is not required for Trane to provide its Equipment and/or Services to the Customer.

"**Equipment**" shall have the meaning set forth in the Agreement.

"**HVAC Machine Data**" means data generated and collected from the product or furnished service without manual entry. HVAC Machine Data is data relating to the physical measurements and operating conditions of a HVAC system, such as but not limited to, temperatures, humidity, pressure, HVAC equipment status. HVAC Machine Data does not include Personal Data and, for the purposes of this agreement, the names of users of Trane's controls products or hosted applications shall not be Personal Data, if any such user chooses to use his/her name(s) in the created accounts within the controls product (e.g., firstname.lastname@address.com). HVAC Machine Data may be used by Trane: (a) to provide better support services and/or products to users of its products and services; (b) to assess compliance with Trane terms and conditions; (c) for statistical or other analysis of the collective characteristics and behaviors of product and services users; (d) to backup user and other data or information and/or provide remote support and/or restoration; (e) to provide or undertake: engineering analysis; failure analysis; warranty analysis; energy analysis; predictive analysis; service analysis; product usage analysis; and/or other desirable analysis, including, but not limited to, histories or trends of any of the foregoing; and (f) to otherwise understand and respond to the needs of users of the product or furnished service. "Personal Data" means data and/or information that is owned or controlled by Customer, and that names or identifies, or is about a natural person, such as: (i) data that is explicitly defined as a regulated category of data under any data privacy laws applicable to Customer; (ii) non-public personal information ("NPI") or personal information ("PI"), such as national identification number, passport number, social security number, social insurance number, or driver's license number; (iii) health or medical information, such as insurance information, medical prognosis, diagnosis information, or genetic information; (iv) financial information, such as a policy number, credit card number, and/or bank account number; (v) personally identifying technical information (whether transmitted or stored in cookies, devices, or otherwise), such as IP address, MAC address, device identifier, International Mobile Equipment Identifier ("IMEI"), or advertising identifier; (vi) biometric information; and/or (vii) sensitive personal data, such as, race, religion, marital status, disability, gender, sexual orientation, geolocation, or mother's maiden name.

"**Security Incident**" shall refer to (i) a compromise of any network, system, application or data in which Customer Data has been accessed or acquired by an unauthorized third party; (ii) any situation where Trane reasonably suspects that such compromise may have occurred; or (iii) any actual or reasonably suspected unauthorized or illegal Processing, loss, use, disclosure or acquisition of or access to any Customer Data.

"**Services**" shall have the meaning set forth in the Agreement.

2. **HVAC Machine Data; Access to Customer Extranet and Third Party Systems.** If Customer grants Trane access to HVAC Machine Data via web portals or other non-public websites or extranet services on Customer's or a third party's website or system (each, an "Extranet"), Trane will comply with the following:
- Accounts.** Trane will ensure that Trane's personnel use only the Extranet account(s) designated by Customer and will require Trane personnel to keep their access credentials confidential.
 - Systems.** Trane will access the Extranet only through computing or processing systems or applications running operating systems managed by Trane that include: (i) system network firewalls; (ii) centralized patch management; (iii) operating system appropriate anti-malware software; and (iv) for portable devices, full disk encryption.
 - Restrictions.** Unless otherwise approved by Customer in writing, Trane will not download, mirror or permanently store any HVAC Machine Data from any Extranet on any medium, including any machines, devices or servers.
 - Account Termination.** Trane will terminate the account of each of Trane's personnel in accordance with Trane's standard practices after any specific Trane personnel who has been authorized to access any Extranet (1) no longer needs access to HVAC Machine Data or (2) no longer qualifies as Trane personnel (e.g., the individual leaves Trane's employment).
 - Third Party Systems.** Trane will provide Customer prior notice before it uses any third party system that stores or may otherwise have access to HVAC Machine Data, unless (1) the data is encrypted and (2) the third party system will not have access to the decryption key or unencrypted "plain text" versions of the HVAC Machine Data.
3. **Customer Data; Confidentiality.** Trane shall keep confidential, and shall not access or use any Customer Data and information that is marked confidential or by its nature is considered confidential ("Customer Confidential Information") other than for the

purpose of providing the Equipment and Services, and will disclose Customer Confidential Information only: (i) to Trane's employees and agents who have a need to know to perform the Services, (ii) as expressly permitted or instructed by Customer, or (iii) to the minimum extent required to comply with applicable law, provided that Trane (1) provides Customer with prompt written notice prior to any such disclosure, and (2) reasonably cooperate with Customer to limit or prevent such disclosure.

4. Customer Data; Compliance with Laws. Trane agrees to comply with laws, regulations governmental requirements and industry standards and practices relating to Trane's processing of Customer Confidential Information (collectively, "**Laws**").
5. Customer Data; Information Security Management. Trane agrees to establish and maintain an information security and privacy program, consistent with applicable HVAC equipment industry practices that complies with this Addendum and applicable Laws ("**Information Security Program**"). The Information Security Program shall include appropriate physical, technical and administrative safeguards, including any safeguards and controls agreed by the Parties in writing, sufficient to protect Customer systems, and Customer's Confidential Information from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification or disclosure. The Information Security Program shall include appropriate, ongoing training and awareness programs designed to ensure that Trane's employees and agents, and others acting on Trane's, behalf are aware of and comply with the Information Security Program's policies, procedures, and protocols.
6. Monitoring. Trane shall monitor and, at regular intervals consistent with HVAC equipment industry practices, test and evaluate the effectiveness of its Information Security Program. Trane shall evaluate and promptly adjust its Information Security Program in light of the results of the testing and monitoring, any material changes to its operations or business arrangements, or any other facts or circumstances that Trane knows or reasonably should know may have a material impact on the security of Customer Confidential Information, Customer systems and Customer property.
7. Audits. Customer acknowledges and agrees that the Trane SOC2 audit report will be used to satisfy any and all audit/inspection requests/requirements by or on behalf of Customer. Trane will make its SOC2 audit report available to Customer upon request and with a signed nondisclosure agreement.
8. Information Security Contact. Trane's information security contact is Local Sales Office.
9. Security Incident Management. Trane shall notify Customer after the confirmation of a Security Incident that affects Customer Confidential Information, Customer systems and Customer property. The written notice shall summarize the nature and scope of the Security Incident and the corrective action already taken or planned.
10. Threat and Vulnerability Management. Trane regularly performs vulnerability scans and addresses detected vulnerabilities on a risk basis. Periodically, Trane engages third-parties to perform network vulnerability assessments and penetration testing. Vulnerabilities will be reported in accordance with Trane's cybersecurity vulnerability reported process. Trane periodically provides security updates and software upgrades.
11. Security Training and Awareness. New employees are required to complete security training as part of the new hire process and receive annual and targeted training (as needed and appropriate to their role) thereafter to help maintain compliance with Security Policies, as well as other corporate policies, such as the Trane Code of Conduct. This includes requiring Trane employees to annually re-acknowledge the Code of Conduct and other Trane policies as appropriate. Trane conducts periodic security awareness campaigns to educate personnel about their responsibilities and provide guidance to create and maintain a secure workplace.
12. Secure Disposal Policies. Trane will maintain policies, processes, and procedures regarding the disposal of tangible and intangible property containing Customer Confidential Information so that wherever possible, Customer Confidential Information cannot be practicably read or reconstructed.
13. Logical Access Controls. Trane employs internal monitoring and logging technology to help detect and prevent unauthorized access attempts to Trane's corporate networks and production systems. Trane will implement policies and procedures required to respond to an emergency or other occurrence (i.e. fire, vandalism, system failure, natural disaster) that could damage Customer Data or any system that contains Customer Data. Procedures include the following
 - (i) Data backups; and
 - (ii) Formal disaster recovery plan. Such disaster recovery plan is tested at least annually.
15. Return of Customer Data. If Trane is responsible for storing or receiving Customer Data, Trane shall, at Customer's sole discretion, deliver Customer Data to Customer in its preferred format within a commercially reasonable period of time following the expiration or earlier termination of the Agreement or, such earlier time as Customer requests, securely destroy or render unreadable or undecipherable each and every original and copy in every media of all Customer's Data in Trane's possession,

custody or control no later than [90 days] after receipt of Customer's written instructions directing Trane to delete the Customer Data.

- 16. Background Checks Trane shall take reasonable steps to ensure the reliability of its employees or other personnel having access to the Customer Data, including the conducting of appropriate background and/or verification checks in accordance with Trane policies.
- 17. DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES. EXCEPT FOR ANY APPLICABLE WARRANTIES IN THE AGREEMENT, THE SERVICES ARE PROVIDED "AS IS", WITH ALL FAULTS, AND THE ENTIRE RISK AS TO SATISFACTORY QUALITY, PERFORMANCE, ACCURACY AND EFFORT AS TO SUCH SERVICES SHALL BE WITH CUSTOMER. Executive Summary:

Move to pass an Ordinance approving amendments to Hanover Park's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, including changes to:

1. Sec. 110-9.5.10., Balconies, to allow balconies with less than 50% of the perimeter abutting an exterior wall, separate columns or posts, and greater than 30% façade coverage.
2. Sec.110-9.8.2.a Minimum Primary Frontage Coverage, to clarify that driveways approved through a Minor Design Exception are exempted from primary frontage calculations; and

Discussion:

Background

As a result of recent development proposals, staff and the Development Commission have noticed potential inconsistencies between the Code and the vision of the community. At the August 14, 2025, Development Commission meeting, staff requested discussion of several potential Text Amendments, including primary frontage coverage requirements and architectural standards for balconies in the Village Center. Additional discussion took place at the September 11th meeting, in addition to the Public Hearing on January 8, 2025.

Analysis

Village Center Balcony Requirements:

Per section 110-9.5.10 of the Village Center code, a minimum 50% of the perimeter of each balcony is required to abut an exterior wall of a building to partially enclose the balconies. Balcony support structures are required to be integrated with the building façade; separate columns or posts are prohibited. Additionally, no more than 30% of a street façade may be covered by balconies.

Staff and the Commission reviewed recently approved developments in light of the Village's vision and reaffirmed that Village Center architecture should:

1. Not include "tack on balconies"
2. Balconies should have "integrated designs" (language in the current Code)
3. Permit more balcony space while avoiding the "motel" look

Based on this, the Commission is recommending:

1. Permitting balconies to be surrounded by less than 50% of the building wall if structural columns are provided.
2. Permitting columns if they are incorporated into the architecture of the building.
3. Permitting balconies to cover 50% of a street façade (an increase from 30%).

Please note that other façade variety and articulation standards still apply, including requirements that larger buildings be broken up into 90' segments, minimum façade transparency, shadow lines, and approved materials.

Village Center Driveway & Façade Coverage Requirements:

Per sections 110-9.3.5 and 110-9.3.6, general and row buildings in the Village Center must occupy 80% of the width of their building sites. The remaining 20% would need to include setbacks, landscaping, and driveways. While driveways cannot be located on Primary Facades, a Minor Design Exception is permitted if there is no other option (like the proposed daycare across the street or a shallow lot on Devon).

Several proposals have come through (some only conceptual) which qualify for the Minor Exception to have a driveway on a Primary Façade but then need a second Major Design Exception because the driveway plus the required side setback exceed 20% of the width of the lot. See Exhibit 3 for an illustration of such a proposal.

In effect, a site with a single townhome building which could get an administrative Design Exception must still come back for a Public Hearing for a Major Design Exception simply because the lots aren't wide enough to accommodate the building and driveway and still have 80% of the site occupied by the building.

The Commission is recommending that a driveway, approved via a Minor Design Exception, be exempt from this frontage calculation. For the example in Exhibit 3, this proposal would enable up to 10' of landscaping along the driveway side.

Public Hearing and Development Commission Recommendation:

Following the Zoning Code and standard Village procedures, the Development Commission held a Public Hearing on January 8, 2026. No members of the public attended the Development Commission Public Hearing or contacted staff to voice concern or support. Following discussion, the Development Commission adopted the attached Findings of Facts and made a unanimous recommendation to the Board for approval as incorporated in the attached Ordinance.

Recommended Action

Motion to accept Development Commission Findings of Fact and pass an Ordinance amending balcony and measuring regulations of Article IX. – Village Center (VC) Zoning Districts of Chapter 110 of the Hanover Park Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BALCONY AND MEASURING REGULATIONS OF ARTICLE IX. - VILLAGE CENTER (VC) ZONING DISTRICTS OF CHAPTER 110 OF THE HANOVER PARK COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Village initiated these amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance by referring them to the Development Commission for its review and recommendation following public hearings thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Development Commission, pursuant to prior published notice all as required by law, has conducted a public hearing on January 8, 2026, on the proposed amendments and has forwarded its written recommendations and report on the amendments to the Village Board; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have reviewed said report and recommendations and determined that such amendments are in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan, in the public interest, and agrees with the report and recommendation; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hanover Park is a home rule unit of local government by virtue of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois and hereby adopts these amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance pursuant to its home rule authority; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hanover Park, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That subparagraphs e. and g. of subsection 9.5.10, Balconies, of Section 110-9.5 concerning general building design; and subparagraph 1. of a. of subsection 9.8.2, Measuring, of Section 110-9.8 concerning definition and measuring both of Article IX Village Center (VC) Zoning Districts of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 110 of the Municipal Code of Hanover Park, is amended by modifying them to read as follows:

“ARTICLE IX VILLAGE CENTER (VC) ZONING DISTRICTS

* * * * *

Sec. 110-9.5. - General building design

* * * * *

9.5.10. Balconies. Balconies facing any street, courtyard, or open space must be consistent with the regulations of this subsection. See Figure 5-F for examples of balconies.

* * * * *

e. *Integrated design.* Balconies are intended to be integrated with the design of the façade, and tacking (or the appearance of tacking) the balconies onto the façade after the elevation has been designed must be avoided.

1. A minimum of 50 percent of the perimeter of each balcony shall abut an exterior wall of the building, partially enclosing the balcony, or shall include structural columns.
2. The balcony support structure, including separate columns or posts are permitted if they are architecturally integrated into the design of the building facade.

* * * * *

g. *Façade coverage.* A maximum of 50 percent of the street façades, calculated separately for each façade, may be covered by balconies. The balcony area is calculated by drawing a rectangle around the following: the platform or floor of the balcony; any rails, walls, columns or indentations; and any ceiling, roof, or upper balcony.

* * * * *

Sec. 110-9.8. – Definitions and measuring

9.8.2. *Measuring.* The following explains the standards outlined on the tables in 110-9.3, Building types and uses, specific to each building type, refer to 9.3.5 through 9.3.8.

- a. *Minimum primary frontage coverage.* The minimum percentage of building façade along the primary frontage of a lot is designated on each building type table.

1. *Measurement.* The width of the principal structures (as measured within the build-to-zone along the frontage edge) is divided by the length of the frontage parallel to the boundary line, right-of-way line, or property line following the street. Refer to Figure 8-H. A boundary line is designated on the master development plan to delineate the space of a street or building site. When a Minor Design Exception to subsection 9.3.4.f.5., Driveways Off Primary Streets, of Sec. 110-9.3 is granted, the width of the approved driveway shall not be included in the length of the frontage for frontage coverage calculations.”

* * * * *

SECTION 2: That each section, paragraph, sentence, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof, other than the part affected by such decision.

SECTION 3: That the Village Clerk be and is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Text Amendments regarding balcony design and driveway façade coverage requirements.

I. Subject

Consideration of Amendments to Hanover Park's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance regarding potential revisions to the Village Center code, including Sec.110-9.8.2.a Minimum Primary Frontage Coverage, to clarify that driveways approved through a Minor Design Exception are exempted from primary frontage calculations; and Sec. 110-9.5.10., Balconies, to allow balconies with less than 50% of the perimeter abutting an exterior wall, separate columns or posts, and greater than 30% façade coverage.

II. Findings

On January 8, 2026, after due notice as required by law, the Hanover Park Development Commission held a public hearing on the subject request concerning the text amendments. No members of the public appeared and voiced their opinion. No objectors appeared and no written objections were filed.

The Development Commission has made the following findings regarding the Village-initiated text amendment request:

Conformity with neighborhood character and existing uses

The proposal is consistent with approved Village Center projects and the Village's vision for the Village Center. Under the proposed code revisions, future development proposals would have more flexibility to complement previously approved projects that received similar design exceptions under existing regulations. Balconies are an amenity and the proposed changes enable provision of balconies with columns that are better integrated architecturally.

The driveway width exclusion from the frontage calculation allows for room for landscaping and clarifies how the frontage should be calculated in case of minor design exceptions.

Trends of development

Certain building types are required to occupy 80% of a lot's frontage. Current Village Center Code standards effectively require a very narrow range of lot widths where a project can comply with the 80 percent maximum building site coverage requirement when a Minor Design Exception is granted to allow a driveway on a primary façade. The intent of providing the Minor Exception for driveways on primary facades was to streamline approvals when an alternative is not available. However, in practice, these projects would require a Major Design Exception, and a public hearing. Exempting driveways from primary frontage calculations when approved through a minor design exception would make compliance with the 80 percent maximum more achievable and allow greater opportunities for landscaping along driveways.

Modern development proposals frequently incorporate greater architectural variety and larger balconies. While a "motel" look is not desirable, the Commission finds that generous balcony space can be an amenity to residents. Existing enclosure requirements and limitations on balcony support structures can constrain these design elements, particularly in multi-unit developments where visible structural supports are common and desirable architectural features.

Environmental impact

Modifying façade coverage requirements would allow for increased landscaping and integration of green space, which may help reduce the extent of impermeable surfaces in new developments. Otherwise, no impact is expected.

Impact on property values

The proposed Village Code modifications are expected to have a positive impact on property values by making good development easier. By allowing greater design flexibility, the amendment may facilitate additional landscaping within the Village Center district.

Compliance with the Hanover Park comprehensive plan

Goal 2.1 of the Comprehensive Plan calls for enhancing housing diversity to support varying income levels, ages, and preferences. In particular, Objective 2.1.3 calls for the Village to encourage infill residential development on vacant properties and redevelopment of under-utilized properties. This Amendment would simplify the approval process, encouraging infill development on vacant properties, development of higher-end housing, and mixed-use, higher-density residential developments.

Fiscal impact

The Village Center amendments would simplify the approval process by reducing the need for design exceptions, which may encourage additional development, increase residential housing opportunities, and strengthen Hanover Park's tax base.

III. Recommendations

Accordingly, by a vote of 6 to 0, the Development Commission recommends the Village Center zoning section of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance be amended as follows – whereby text to be deleted is shown with a strike-through (~~deleted~~), and text to be added is shown in *italics* and underlined.

Balconies

Sec. 110-9.5.10 – Balconies

e. *Integrated design.* Balconies are intended to be integrated with the design of the façade, and tacking (or the appearance of tacking) the balconies onto the façade after the elevation has been designed must be avoided.

1. A minimum of 50 percent of the perimeter of each balcony shall abut an exterior wall of the building, partially enclosing the balcony, or shall include structural columns.

Executive Summary

Move to pass an Ordinance approving Amendments to Hanover Park's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance regarding regulations pertaining to level 3 EV charging stations, including changes to section:

- 1) Sec. 110-6.6.2.w, Accessory uses and structures in nonresidential districts, to establish criteria for allowing some level 3 EV charging stations as accessory permitted uses.

Discussion

The Village is supportive of and interested in promoting the use of electric vehicles (EVs). The Village's 2010 Comprehensive Plan embraces green technology, green building design, and sustainable energy. In 2023, the Village adopted several amendments to the Zoning Code to facilitate and regulate EV charging stations, including establishing definitions for EV charging stations, revising off-street parking and loading requirements, and incorporating additional standards for advertising signage on mechanical equipment. However, under the current Zoning Code, all level 3 EV charging stations—regardless of size, scale, or scope—are required to undergo a public hearing process for approval.

Staff conducted a survey of 11 Chicago-area communities regarding their regulations and approval processes for level 3 EV charging stations. Based on the survey results, staff determined that Hanover Park is the only surveyed community that requires all level 3 EV charging stations to be approved as Special Uses. The Village has also experienced a notable increase in requests for level 3 EV charging stations over the past year.

Increased demand, combined with a review of regulations in surrounding municipalities and the Village's long-standing vision to promote sustainable land use and development patterns, has informed the Development Commission's support for streamlining the

approval process and encouraging the installation of Level 3 EV Charging Stations within commercial districts.

The Development Commission discussed potential amendments regarding level 3 EV charging stations at their regular meeting on August 8, 2025 and continued discussion on November 13, 2025. No recommendations were made and no votes were taken during these meetings. Feedback from the Development Commission at these meetings included the following:

- They supported permitting level 3 EV chargers by-right if a parking lot exceeds the number of spaces required by Code.
- They supported establishing a maximum number of vehicles served as the metric for determining when a Special Use Permit would be required.
- They did not support setting a maximum parking percentage to delineate when a special use permit is required.

(Please note that all installations will trigger Site Plan and Landscaping Plan review.)

Public Hearing and Development Commission Recommendation:

Following the Zoning Code and standard Village procedures, the Development Commission held a Public Hearing on January 8, 2026. Following the hearing and discussion, the Development Commission adopted the attached Findings of Facts and made a unanimous recommendation to the Board for approval as incorporated in the attached Ordinance.

Text Amendment to permitting some Level 3 EV Charging Stations to be Permitted Accessory Uses.

I. Subject

Consideration of an Amendment to Hanover Park's Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance regarding regulations pertaining to electric vehicle charging, including changes to 110-6.6.2, Accessory uses and structures in nonresidential districts, to establish criteria for allowing some level 3 EV charging stations as accessory permitted uses.

II. Findings

On January 8, 2026, after due notice as required by law, the Hanover Park Development Commission held a public hearing on the subject request concerning the text amendment. No members of the public appeared and voiced their opinion. No objectors appeared and no written objections were filed.

The Development Commission has made the following findings regarding the Village-initiated text amendment request:

Conformity with neighborhood character and existing uses

Level 3 chargers are currently an accessory Special Use. The proposal is only to make some smaller installations permitted accessory uses. Chargers for 4 or fewer cars are not expected to have a negative impact on neighborhood character. By triggering site and landscaping plan review, this may encourage more properties to conform to Code.

Trends of development

EV chargers are increasingly considered an amenity for commercial properties and are being encouraged by the State. The Village has seen an increase in requests for this use.

Environmental impact

EV chargers make the adoption of electric vehicles easier. Electric vehicles have a smaller environmental impact on the Village than the internal combustion vehicles they would replace.

Impact on property values

The Commission expects negligible effects on surrounding property values. By triggering site and landscaping plan review, streamlining EV charger approval may encourage more site to be brought to Code.

Compliance with the Hanover Park comprehensive plan

The Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 2010, well before electric vehicles were a major consideration in planning processes. However, sustainability is a major theme of the plan.

“Creation of incentives to foster green development and sustainability: The Village should encourage residents and businesses to use green technology and practice energy conservation via educational campaigns, tax and other incentives and adoption of such uses and practices throughout Village government so as to lead by example.”

In particular, Vision 4 states that, “Vision 4: Hanover Park will promote sustainability in land use patterns and development.”

Fiscal impact

The Commission expects a positive fiscal impact. Additional EV chargers are expected to bring in utility tax revenue and may increase EAV of properties where the chargers are installed.

III. Recommendations

Accordingly, by a vote of 6 to 0, the Development Commission recommends approval of the request.

Executive Summary

Move to pass a Resolution approving a Final Plat of Morningside Subdivision, a Re-Subdivision of Lots 19-25 (inclusive) in Block 23 in Grant Highway Subdivision and Lot 1 in Virons Subdivision, Cook County, Illinois.

Discussion

On May 3, 2018, the Village Board approved Ordinance O-18-12 which grants a Special Use for Car Wash and granted variances regarding lot size, building setback, and landscape on the property at 2016-2020 Lake Street for the purpose of constructing the EverClean Car Wash in conformance with a Site Plan. The car wash is open for business, and the owner would like to consolidate the eight (8) parcels which comprise the zoning lot into one lot of record.

Sec. 90-64 (f) of the Village Municipal Code provides for "Alternate final plat approval" without review by Development Commission if the Final Plat of Subdivision complies with the approved preliminary subdivision plan, and the Subdivision and Zoning Chapters, as determined by the Zoning Administrator and the Village Engineer. Final Engineering was approved prior to construction. The Village Engineer has reviewed the Final Plat and recommends approval. All requirements for Final Plat have been met. Immediately north of the subject property is a public alley; the property is irregularly shaped with the western seven (7) lots (Lots 19-25 of the Grant Highway Subdivision) extending 6' north into the alley. A public easement over this 6' portion of the property is noted on the Final Plat.

Recommended Action

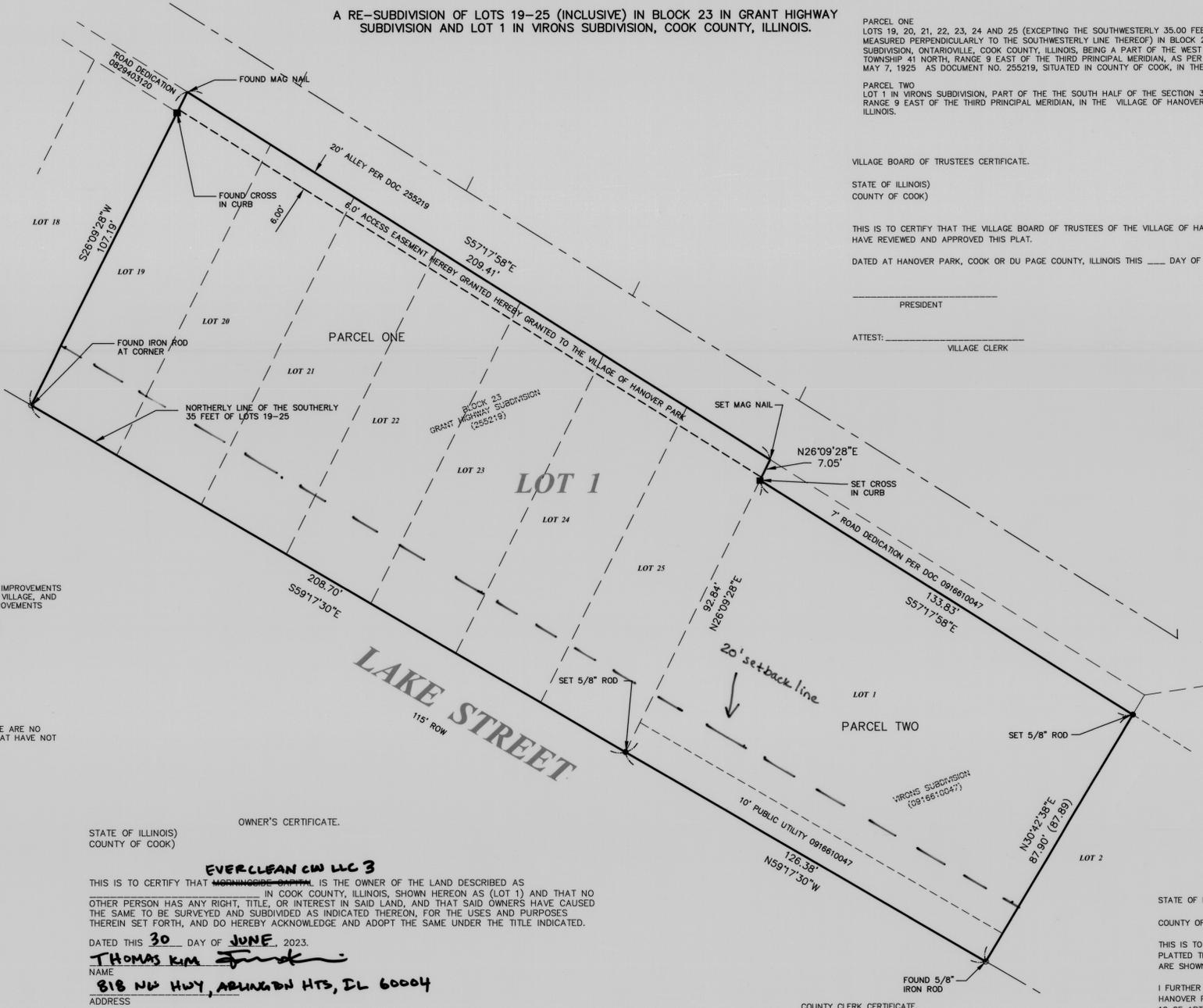

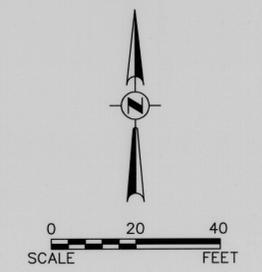

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting the Village President and Board of Trustees approve a three-year license renewal with Sentinel Technologies for Broadcom VMware Cloud Foundation Licensing in the amount of \$86,880.

Discussion

The Village has utilized VMware for server virtualization since 2011. Originally, it was installed to run the Cisco phone system. In 2016, the VMware virtualization was expanded to include a server for the public accessible web services for the community, and then all internal virtual servers in 2017. In April 2023, the Village replaced the servers with new hardware (Cisco) and upgraded the VMware virtualization software. This system is the main production server system that runs all of the virtual servers for phone system, enterprise applications, network administration, user management, file sharing, print servers, databases, document management and cyber security.

In November 2023, VMware was purchased by Broadcom. In 2025, CIO Gerstein was notified that Broadcom now requires three-year agreements and had significantly increased the annual cost. Upon notice, staff began researching alternatives to VMware to identify the best path forward for the Village. As part of the budget process, after comprehensive research and taking into consideration the age of our current system, purchased in 2023, CIO Gerstein recommended that the Village move forward with the proposed three-year agreement. This will ensure the usage of the full life cycle of the current Cisco server infrastructure.

During the three-year period, the IT department will research other options for server virtualization or additional opportunities to transition current software applications to cloud-based systems.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting approval from the Village President and Board of Trustees to establish a blanket purchase order with Ray O'Herron, Inc., in the amount of \$59,600 for the purchase of uniforms. These funds are accounted for in the FY2026 Budget.

Discussion

Ray O'Herron, Inc. has been the Police Department's uniform and equipment vendor since 2017. Ray O'Herron has a brick-and-mortar store located in Downers Grove, which allows the Village to send employees directly to the store to be measured and outfitted with their uniforms and equipment. Police Department employees can bring items directly to the store for exchange and repair, and newly ordered items are often picked up the same day. Additionally, they offer weekly shipping and can ship to the Department within a minimum of one business day.

In 2026, the Police Department requested quotes from five vendors on 43 commonly used items. The five vendors included Eagle Uniform, Galls, JG Uniforms, Ray O'Herron and Streichers. JG Uniforms and Streichers did not provide any quotes. Galls was the lowest-priced vendor on several items, followed closely by Ray O'Herron. Galls was the Police Department's uniform vendor in 2015 and 2016; however, Galls only provides online service and does not have any stores in the area.

The Police Department has been satisfied with the service, pricing, and convenience of Ray O'Herron, Inc., and wishes to maintain them as our uniform source for FY 2026.

Executive Summary

As part of the FY2026 budget discussions, staff presented a proposal to diversify the Village's revenue sources in response to the continued decline in Cable Franchise Fee revenues. During a Board workshop on January 15th, staff provided information related to a potential streaming tax. Staff proposed amending Chapter 94, Taxation of the Municipal Code by adding an additional amusement-type tax to include streaming services, at a rate of 5%, to become effective May 1, 2026.

Discussion

In recent years, municipalities have seen a decline in Cable Franchise Fee revenues, currently based on 5% of gross revenues received by cable companies. This decline is primarily attributed to the widespread shift from traditional cable television subscriptions to streaming-based services. The table below illustrates the Village's Cable Franchise Fee collections from FY2015 through FY2024, which have shown a steady decline over the past decade.

Assuming the same downward trajectory without a policy change, staff has projected the revenue for 2025 – 2030. From 2024 to 2025, revenues are projected to drop from \$237K to \$205K, roughly a 13.5% decline. If this decline continues, staff estimates by 2030 that the franchise fees will fall below \$100K, which is a 51.7% drop from 2025.

To address this revenue loss, staff proposes amending Chapter 94, Taxation of the Municipal Code, adding an additional amusement-type tax for streaming services. Streaming service providers would be required to collect this 5% local amusement tax. All streaming services, including video streaming, audio streaming, and online games, that provide taxable streaming amusements to residents with a billing address within the Village limits would be subject to the tax. This would apply to both one-time streaming video rentals and recurring monthly subscription fees.

The streaming tax would not apply to streaming services provided by not-for-profit organizations which are exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, any school district or any governmental entity. The streaming tax does not include cable services.

Without exact data, staff estimates that households pay an annual average of \$720.00 for streaming services. Using 5%, each household would pay a streaming tax of \$36.00 annually based on the average costs. This could generate \$360,000 in revenue for the Village.

Although the tax can be passed onto residents, the service provider is liable for collecting and remitting it directly to the Village, similar to the Food and Beverage tax. Staff would prepare communication to a list of streaming service companies that may need to remit to the Village. The communication would include an introductory letter explaining the tax, a copy of the ordinance, registration form, and a form for calculating and remitting the tax each month.

ORDINANCE O-26-**ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 94 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF HANOVER PAR BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE XVII IMPOSING A TAX ON STREAMING AMUSEMENT**

WHEREAS, the Village of Hanover Park is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority pursuant to its home rule status and under Section 11- 42-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-42-5, to license, tax, and regulate theatricals, exhibitions, shows, amusements, and places for amusement, among other things; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees desire to amend Chapter 94 of the Municipal Code of Hanover Park, Illinois,, as amended, by adding a new Article XVII imposing a tax on electronically transmitted streaming amusements in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that it will serve and be in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Chapter 94 by adding Article XVII to the Village of Hanover Park Municipal Code pursuant to this Ordinance, now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hanover Park, Cook and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. That the Municipal Code of the Village of Hanover Park, as amended, is hereby amended to add a new Article XVII, titled “Streaming Amusement Tax,” to read as follows:

“ARTICLE XVII. – STREAMING AMUSMENT TAX**Sec. 94-400. – Title.**

This article and the taxes imposed shall be known and cited as the Village of Hanover Park Municipal Streaming Amusement Tax.

Sec. 94-401. – Definitions.

Unless otherwise expressly stated, the following words or terms, for purposes of this Article, will have the meaning indicated in this Section:

- a. Fee. Any fee or charge made or received for the privilege to use, access, subscribe, right to participate, or otherwise right to access, any streaming amusement, whether or not represented by a ticket or admission stub, or receipt of any kind, exclusive of state or federal taxes.
- b. Person. Any individual, firm, trust, estate, partnership, association, joint stock company, joint venture, corporation, limited liability company, municipal corporation, or any of its political subdivisions of this State, or a receiver, trustee, conservator or other representative appointed by order of any court.
- c. Streaming Amusement. Any video streaming, audio streaming, or remotely-accessed online games made available to persons on a rental or subscription basis, but not transactions where the person pays for the rights of permanent use, where the right of access is purchased by any person with a billing address in the Village. For streaming amusements delivered electronically to mobile devices, the requirements of the Illinois Mobile Telecommunications Sourcing Conformity Act, 35 ILCS 638/1 et seq., as amended, will be utilized for purposes of determining which customers and charges are subject to the tax imposed by this Article. "Streaming amusement" does not include cable service or video service provided on a commercial basis offered by a holder subject to a service provider fee pursuant to Section 21-801 of the Illinois Public Utilities Act, 220 ILCS 5/21-801, or such service offered by an incumbent cable operator subject to a fee paid to the local unit of government as described in 47 U.S.C. § 542. As used in this Section, "cable service," "holder," "incumbent cable operator," and "video service" have the meanings set forth in Section 21-201 of the Illinois Public Utilities Act, 220 ILCS 5/21-201.

Sec. 94-402. - Streaming Amusement Tax Imposed.

There is hereby levied and imposed a tax upon every person who pays a fee for a streaming amusement at the rate of 5% of each fee. The tax imposed in this Article is in addition to all other taxes imposed by the State of Illinois or any municipal corporation or political subdivision thereof.

Sec. 94-403 – Collection, Remittance, And Enforcement of Taxes.

- a. The ultimate incidence of and liability for payment of the tax will be borne by the person who seeks the privilege to use, access, subscribe, right to participate, or otherwise right to access any streaming amusement. However, it is the duty of every person receiving a fee upon which a tax is levied under this Article, herein referred to as the "taxpayer," to secure the tax from the consumer, at the time the fee or charge is collected, and remit the tax to the Village Finance Department once each month.
- b. The Village Finance Director is hereby designated as the administrative and enforcement officer of the tax hereby imposed on behalf of the Village. It is the responsibility and duty of the Finance Director to collect all amounts due the Village from the taxpayer. Each taxpayer must file a sworn monthly streaming amusement tax return on a form prescribed by the Finance Director showing all receipts for all charges and fees attributable to streaming amusements sold during the preceding month. The returns are to be filed within 20 days of the end of each month

accompanied by payment to the Village of all taxes herein due for the month most recently ended and covered by the return.

c. The Village Finance Director or their designee may inspect and audit the books and records of a taxpayer. The Village through the Finance Director shall have the right to recompute any amounts determined to be payable under this Article. Any additional amount found due as a result of the audit/and or recomputation shall be paid within 30 days following written notice to the taxpayer. The process and rules and regulations concerning the audit or any amount due pursuant to this Article, shall be subject to and the rights of the taxpayer shall be in accordance with Article IX of this Chapter 94. It is unlawful for any person to prevent, hinder, or interfere with the Finance Director or his or her duly authorized deputy or representative in the discharge of his or her duties hereunder.

d. It is the duty of every taxpayer to keep accurate and complete books and records and to keep same at the taxpayer's principle place of business, containing all information necessary for the collection of the tax hereby imposed, to which the Finance Director or the Director's designee may, at all times, have full access, in-person or remotely, which records must include a monthly sheet showing all fees or charges collected, and streaming amusement taxes collected, during the current and twelve preceding months.

e. In the event that the inspection, examination, and/or recomputation by the Village Finance Director or the Director's designee discloses a discrepancy of 5% or more of the tax owed based on the information furnished by the taxpayer, the cost of the Village's inspection, examination and/or recomputation will be borne by the taxpayer and the taxpayer shall pay interest at the rate of 1.5 percent per month on the amount of the discrepancy until paid in full plus a penalty of 25% of the amount of the discrepancy.

Sec. 94-404 – Exceptions.

The tax described in this Article does not apply to any streaming amusement shown, exhibited, or staged by:

- a. A not-for-profit organization which is exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;
- b. Any school district; or
- c. Any governmental entity.

Sec. 94 -405– Penalties.

Penalties. It is unlawful for any person to show, exhibit, stage, or conduct any streaming amusement without collection and payment of the tax in accordance with the terms of this Article.

- a. Upon request of the Village Manager, the Village Attorney will bring or cause to be brought an action against any taxpayer that fails to remit payment for any tax due to the Village under

this Article to enforce the payment of the tax on behalf of the Village in the Village’s Administrative Adjudication Division and/or a court of competent jurisdiction.

b. Any conviction resulting from an enforcement action will not relieve or discharge any civil liability for non-payment of the tax due.

c. Any taxpayer that fails to remit payment for any tax due to the Village under this Article within ten days after the payment is due, interest will accumulate and be due upon the tax at the rate of a 1.5 percent per month.

d. In addition to the provision of this Article, any taxpayer found guilty in the Village’s Adjudication Division and/or a court of competent jurisdiction of violating, disobeying, omitting, neglecting, or refusing to comply with or resisting or opposing the enforcement of any provision of this Article, upon a finding of liability therefore, will be fined, in addition to any other penalty provided in this Article not more than \$1500. Each day any violation of this Article shall be a separate offense.”

SECTION 3: That each section, paragraph, sentence, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance nor any part thereof, other than the part affected by such decision.

SECTION 4: That except as to the amendments heretofore mentioned, all chapters and section of the Municipal Code of the Village of Hanover Park, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: That this Ordinance shall, by authority of the Village Board of the Village of Hanover Park, be published in pamphlet form. From and after ten days after said publication, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect, provided, however, that the tax provided for and imposed herein shall apply to fees due to a taxpayer and incurred on or after May 1, 2026 for the privilege to use, access, subscribe, right to participate, or otherwise right to access, any streaming amusement.
