The mission of the center is to provide immigrant and refugee individuals and families with an array of service, information, programs and classes to assist in their path towards successful integration to the state. Therefore, creating self-sustaining and thriving communities.



The Illinois Welcoming Center is a comprehensive service center for the integration of immigrants and refugees in Illinois. Its innovative model eliminates systemic barriers that immigrants may have in approaching state services. It changes the way state services are delivered, not focusing on a discrete set of programs available from different state agencies, but rather providing a holistic model which is a true one-stop center where immigrants and refugees may access quality services from multiple state agencies and community providers in one location.

Voting Online Registration



On July 1, online registration and Public Act 98-0691 went into effect. For the November election, the new law will expand registration and voting opportunities, most notably by extending early voting and allowing "Election Day registration" at select sites.

Here is what you need to know regarding P.A. 98-0691:

- The Illinois State Board of Elections website now allows citizens with an IL driver's license or state ID to register to vote online.
- Anyone may promote online voter registration by placing registration links on their website, Facebook, Twitter or through email.
- Election Day registration: Voters will be able to register and cast ballots on Election Day at limited sites. Voters who take part in Election Day registration will cast a provisional ballot. Applicants must have two forms of identification, one of which must include a current address. No photo ID is required.
- Grace period registration will be extended to the Sunday and Monday before Election Day at limited sites. Grace period voters who cast their ballot on Monday must cast a provisional ballot.
- Early voting will extend an extra day, to the Sunday before the election.
- The Monday-Friday before the election, early voting sites will remain open an additional two hours, until 7pm.
- A photo ID is not required for early voting during the 2014 general election. Signature verification will continue to be done.
- Voters may submit their applications for mail ballots to their election authorities starting 90 days before the election (it was previously 40 days). Note that while mail ballot applications can be sent in earlier, the timeline of when ballots are mailed out to voters remains unchanged.

New Hazardous Materials Response Squad Hits the Streets

The Hanover Park Fire Department has placed in service a newly built and custom designed Hazardous Materials Response Squad. This unit replaces a 26-year-old squad that has served the department well.

Hanover Park Fire Department participates as part of a regional response system designed to share resources and personnel for incidents involving technical emergency response needs. This system, known as MABAS (Mutual Aid Box Alarm System), brings together experts in a variety of fields to develop response teams to handle specialized and often very dangerous incidents involving hazardous materials, water rescue, and technical rescues such as structural collapse, trench collapse, confined space, and high angle incidents involving rope rescues.

The new Squad was designed in partnership with the Regional Hazardous Materials Response Team. Hanover Park purchased the vehicle with each of the regional department contributing the funds needed to equip and supply the unit. The new Squad will respond not only to calls within the Village, but will serve as a Rapid Response Squad for the region and also as part of the Statewide Response Plan.

When deployed as part of the Hazmat Statewide Response Team, the Squad will also bring along regional assets that allow the team to be fully self-contained for a 7 day period including housing and meals, a light tower and generator, an ATV, and a mass victim decontamination unit.

The Department is very proud of this updated asset and its role in the region and within the State of Illinois.

Fire Prevention Week Open House Saturday, October 4 - 10:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m.

The Hanover Park Fire Department will be hosting its annual Open House at Fire Station No. 1, located at 6850 Barrington Road. The day will be filled with demonstrations and displays from area community organizations.

Demonstrations will include a simulated vehicle accident with extrication and a simulated hazardous materials incident.



Station tours will run throughout the day, and Fire Department personnel will be on hand to answer any questions you may have. Firefighters will also be showing off the engines, tower ladder, and ambulances.

There will be combat courses for both children **AND** adults to put their firefighting abilities to the test. Plan to come out and join us for a fun-filled day, and remember to bring your camera.

Change Your Clock, Change Your Battery



Daylight savings time ends at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, November 2nd. Remember to set your clocks back an hour. That's also the date that you need to make another change, which could save the life of you or your loved ones, by changing the batteries in your smoke detectors. Changing smoke detector batteries is one of the simplest, most effective ways to help reduce tragic injuries or death related to house fires. The "Change Your Clock, Change Your Battery" campaign urges you to change smoke detector batteries when changing clocks in the Spring and Fall. It's a change that could save your life!

- **Keep your smoke detectors working** - Clean the detector, and change batteries at least once a year. Dust and cobwebs can impair sensitivity of the detectors.
- **Test your smoke detector monthly** - To do this, press the battery test button on the front of the smoke detector. If a high pitch sound is heard, the battery is working properly.





6th Annual Household Recycling Event

The Hanover Park Environmental Committee will be hosting their Household Recycling Event from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 27 at the Commuter Lot located at the intersection of Lake Street and Church Street. Call 630.823.5706 or log on to www.hpil.org for details.

Acceptable items for recycling include:

- Bicycles, wheel chairs and crutches (must be in working, usable condition)
- Personal documents for shredding (provided by Iron Mountain) no businesses, hard covers, binders, binder clips, or books (limit three boxes per vehicle)
- Prescription and over-the-counter drugs (black out all prescription label information), medicated ointments, shampoos, liquids containing medication, prescription and over-the-counter inhalers, glass thermometers and other instruments containing mercury
- Motor oil and antifreeze
- Eye glasses, hearing aids, keys
- Scrap metal
- Large lead-acid batteries (auto, sump pump, SLA, marine batteries)
- Household batteries
- Cell phones and ink-jet cartridges
- CFL bulbs
- Clean, usable child and adult clothing
- Fire extinguishers
- Holiday lights and extension cords



Household office equipment and electronic items (such as computers and monitors, TVs, VCRs, stereos, microwave ovens, cameras, video game equipment, and so on; see the Village web site for a complete list). All electronic items are recycled; none are resold or sent to organizations for re-use.

Electronic Recycling Program Ends in Hanover Park

The Village of Hanover Park has halted its daily electronics recycling program due to a vendor issue, effective at the close of business on Thursday, July 31.



The Village was part of a program with DuPage County where free electronics recycling was provided on a daily basis. The company under contract with the County has informed the County and all communities that they are no longer able to provide the service. While the Village and DuPage County staff are investigating ways to keep this program in operation, it is unable to do so at this time. Residents are reminded that State Law prohibits them from placing items in the garbage, as they cannot be placed in the landfill.

The Village has a list on its website that shows locations where residents can drop off their electronics. "It is very unfortunate that this program is not able to continue at this time, as it was heavily used by residents of the Village of Hanover Park and surrounding communities" according to Howard Killian, Director of Public Works. During its 3-year operation, the Village collected over 472,565 tons of electronics for recycling.



Electric Aggregation Program Update

Back in 2012, the Village entered into a contract with Verde Solutions. This contract was entered into to help residents purchase electricity at rates lower than ComEd's rates. Recently, the annual contract with Verde Solutions expired. The Village sought bids for a renewal program, but the rates received were significantly higher and offered little or no expected savings versus the ComEd default rate. Therefore, the Village made the decision to suspend the program and transfer residents back to ComEd, effective August 1st.

Residents enrolled in the Village's program may have received a letter in the mail regarding this matter. Please note that this was merely a confirmation, and you do not need to take any action to be moved back to the ComEd supply rate.
