Minute with the Mayor

I have had a busy winter working to support the needs of our community. At the U. S. Conference of Mayors (USCM), Mayors had the opportunity to discuss issues of importance with IL Senator Durbin. The Senator is very supportive of our Education & Work Center initiative, our investment in crime prevention, the Narcan Heroin awareness program, and efforts to collaborate with our neighboring communities to keep our taxes low.

The Governor has a plan to eliminate \$1.8 million from our Village’s revenue. The Governor and State representatives have been trying to understand how possible cuts would affect communities. Therefore, in March, I provided testimony before the Senate Appropriations I & II Committees in Chicago. I stated that the loss of \$1.8 Million dollars in revenue of Hanover Park is the equivalent of a tax levy increase of 17.17% on homeowners. I also strongly

stated that the elected officials of Hanover Park cannot pass along that additional burden to our property owners. A loss would have an impact on all services provided by the Village. Our efforts were helpful to defer an immediate capture by the State of the local revenue our Municipality relies upon for the services we provide. We need responsible leadership and we need our Governor and Legislators to solve the fiscal problem that was created in Springfield. Therefore, Hanover Park will continue to provide feedback outlining the direct impact of Gov. Bruce Rauner’s proposed plan.

The Hanover Park Veteran’s committee will host a Memorial Day Service Event on Monday, May 25, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at the Veterans Memorial at Village Hall. If you are able, please stop by as we honor those who have served our country. On Wednesday, June 3, 2015, and in partnership with the Hanover Park Chamber of Commerce, I will be hosting the “State of the Village” at the Education & Work Center in the Hanover Square Shopping Center on Barrington Road. I will give an annual update on the Village and share our hopes for the future as the economy begins to turn around. This will be a great opportunity for attendees to learn more about what is going on in the Village and to meet our newest Trustee Herb Porter Jr.

Recently, Hanover Park held its annual “Kids At Hope” Resource Day at the Park District. Thank you to all the participants. Additionally, thanks to the Park District for their support for opening their doors to support the Resource Day. Thank you to Tony Sanders, CEO, U-46 for his leadership to bring the area leaders together. He is a model of collaboration and communication. He is clearly committed to support the children and families in School District U-46. Together all children have hope for the future. Kids do have opportunities in Hanover Park!

Finally, it continues to be my pleasure to represent the people of Hanover Park, our hometown. Take the time to volunteer and give back to our wonderful town, at the schools, churches, or assisting on the playing field. We cannot do it without you! We are a Village that believes all youth will achieve and have hope for success without exception. Curb Appeal Program Code Enforcement



Each year the Hanover Park Code Enforcement Unit inspects all residential properties as part of its Curb Appeal Program. When violations are found, the resident is notified with a door hanger tag and a follow-up letter via U.S. mail. Often, residents are already planning on making the needed repairs in the coming months. If a resident needs more time than allotted in the initial notification, we recommend they contact the Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) listed on the notice for an extension. The key is maintaining communication with the CEO and making a good faith effort to achieve compliance with the regulations.

The goal of the Curb Appeal Program is to work with the residents of the Village to gain compliance. The CEO's and Appearance Officer will work with residents to get the property maintenance issues resolved so that the property looks good and the owner is not summoned to housing court.

The following are some common items requiring correction:

- Tall grass and weeds (over 8 inches in height);
- Garbage and recycling containers illegally stored in front of the home or at the side of the home in public view. Store the containers behind the Home with tight-fitting lids or keep them inside your garage;
- House address numbers not displayed on the front of the house (numerals not less than 4 inches high);
- Driveways in serious disrepair;
- Missing or torn window screens;
- Rotting wood or peeling paint on the exterior;
- Gutters and downspouts not in good repair;
- Inoperable vehicles (including vehicles not displaying current license plates) may not be stored except in a garage or, no more than one vehicle under a commercially manufactured cover in good condition;
- No bare areas or ruts in grass caused by pedestrians or vehicles;
- Holiday decorations must be removed within 90 days of the Holiday.

Preventing Child Abuse: When Parenting Gets Tough

Child abuse and neglect can leave damaging emotional scars on a child. Abused or neglected children feel unsafe, uncared for, and alone. Children who have been abused or neglected may have trouble trusting others, find themselves in unhealthy relationships, have low self-esteem, and have trouble regulating their emotions. Adult survivors of abuse may struggle with anxiety, depression, or anger; may turn to alcohol or drugs to numb the painful feelings; or may have trouble functioning at home, work or school.

Being a parent is one of the most rewarding jobs in the world, but it can be overwhelming at times. Too much stress can make it hard to parent effectively and can trigger anger and frustration. Adults sometimes need to examine their own behavior and take a hard look at what is normal and what is abusive. You may be crossing the line into abuse if you can't stop your anger once it starts, you feel emotionally disconnected from your child and wish he/she would just be quiet and leave you alone, or you have difficulty managing your child's daily routine without becoming overwhelmed.

Recognizing that you have a problem is the biggest step to getting help. You are the most important person in your child's life and it is worth the effort to make a change. Developing new parenting skills and learning how to take care of yourself and regulate your emotions can go a long way to prevent child abuse. You don't have to do it alone; help and support are available. Feel free to contact me if you would like more information. A REMINDER TO KEEP YOUR GRASS MOWED LESS THAN 8 INCHES IN HEIGHT!

The Code Enforcement Unit would like to remind residents that Village Ordinance 18-91-302.4 makes it unlawful for a property owner to allow any weed, grass or plant (except ornamental trees, bushes or flowers) to exceed eight inches in height. Neighborhoods remain pleasant places to live and property values are protected when property maintenance ordinances are followed. Spring Clean-up & Projects

Spring is here! As the days become longer, and the warm weather makes a long awaited return, we will soon find ourselves getting outside cleaning up the yards after a long winter. Here are some simple safety tips to keep in mind while completing these projects:

1. State law requires you to contact JULIE before you start any digging project, no matter how small the project or how deep you plan to dig. There are two convenient ways to reach J.U.L.I.E:
 - The toll-free number, 1-800-892-0123, is staffed 24 hours per day, 365 days per year.
 - Or you can visit www.illinois1call.com
2. Before using lawn mowers/chainsaws/weed whackers or other power tools, ensure that all motors, blades, cords and safety components are in place and operating correctly.
3. For information regarding locations for disposal of hazardous waste, paint or other various items, you can visit www.hpil.org, www.dupageco.org/recycling, www.countyofkane.org/recycling

As part of your outdoor spring cleaning ritual, you should also ensure that your address – house/apt numbers – are mounted on the front of your residence (and mailbox if applicable). The numbers should contrast with the color of the residence (in the area where they are mounted) and should be clearly visible from the street .

Roadway Conditions Analysis Planned

In order to proactively plan for and schedule cost effective maintenance of 95 miles of streets in Hanover Park, the Village has hired IMS Infrastructure Management Services, to complete a comprehensive street evaluation for the development of a pavement management program. The field work is investigative in nature and is non-destructive.

Field work is anticipated to begin in May and will last a couple weeks. IMS will be driving a white van equipped with cameras and flashing warning lights, and/or a pick-up truck with a small trailer. No road closures will be necessary and work will not generate loud or disturbing noise. Once the data collected is analyzed the Village will come up with a plan to schedule short and long-term street resurfacing and reconstruction.



Garage Sale Reminders

As the weather improves and the garage sale season sets in, the Village of Hanover Park would like to remind residents of the following garage sale sign regulations:

- Signs may only be displayed on private property.
- Signs may not be attached to trees, utility poles, parked vehicles, fences, or roofs.
- Signs are not permitted in Village parkway; that is the area between the sidewalk and the street.
- Only one sign per property, two for corner lots.
- Signs may not exceed six square feet per side and four feet in height.
- Off-site signs are permitted only on private property with the consent of the owner.
- Signs must identify the date and address of the sale.
- Signs may only be displayed on day prior to, and on the day of the sale.

Property owners may receive citations based upon repeat offenses.

No permits are required for garage sales. However, signs that violate the sign regulation
