Holiday Safety Tips

The holiday season is upon us and we will find our schedules filled with many seasonal activities. Unfortunately, this is also a time when the criminal element uses our schedules and softening of our safety techniques to take advantage. We need to take a moment to remind ourselves of some general crime prevention techniques.

- * Do not leave your car running unattended. It is unsafe and illegal.
- * Take your time when driving, increase your space between cars, be aware of black ice, have your vehicle winterized (scraper, fluids, tire condition, full tank of gas.)
- * Make sure to keep your car doors locked. The vast majority of thefts from motor vehicles occur from vehicles with unlocked doors.
- * Place bags, packages, electronics, and change in your trunk or out of sight. Do not make the burglar's job easy.
- * Make your house look as if someone is always home. Keep lights on the inside and outside, using timers to achieve this when no one is home. Make sure your interior garage door is locked and that you close the exterior door.
- * When shopping, do not overburden yourself with too many packages or bags, your purse or wallet could be an easy mark for thieves. Be aware of your surroundings.
- * Keep a records of the serial numbers for all big ticket purchases, take a picture of it, inscribe it with something that will help it to be identified for example your initials or address. Break down the boxes these items come in before you place them out on the curb. What you put out will advertise what you have in your home.
- * Be a "Nosey" Neighbor. Call **911** whenever you see or hear any suspicious people or activity. Try to get a description, license plate, direction of travel, and description what they are doing.
- * If you are going on vacation, contact the Police Department at **630.823.5500** and have your house placed on the vacation watch list.

Overnight Parking Program Ordinance #62-11-1327(a)

With the holidays and visiting relatives, you may find a need to park a vehicle on the street between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.



To get permission you will need access to the internet and a valid email address. Visit our website at: <http://www.hpil.org/Services/Police/Night-Parking>.

Request must be received prior to 2:00 a.m. cutoff.

Complete the information as requested.

A confirmation of your request will be sent to the email address you provided. You will need this just in case a ticket is issued in error. Night Parking permission is given four times every thirty days per household.

If you do not have access to the internet simply call **630.823.5500**.

Winter Parking Regulations

NO PARKING on Village streets after TWO inch snowfall

62-11-1323. Limited parking for snow removal. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village at any time within 24 hours after a snowfall of two inches or more has occurred, except on those streets where late night parking is permitted in Section 62-11-1327(b), that within 24 hours after a snowfall of two or more inches vehicles shall be parked only on the side of the street on the day during which late night parking is permitted.

Keep the Wreath Red Program



“Keep the Wreath Red” is a holiday fire safety program designed to increase fire safety awareness. In the event of a holiday related fire, firefighters will replace one of the red bulbs with a white one. The goal is to keep the bulbs on the wreath red.

Holiday Safety Tips

Trees: Set the tree trunk in a sturdy, water-holding stand with wide spread feet. Keep trees away from fireplaces, radiators, other heat sources, doorways and foot traffic. Always keep the water tray full so the tree stays moist. When tree becomes brittle, discontinue using the lights.

Decorating the Tree: Purchase tinsel or artificial icicles of a non-leaded material. Avoid decorations that break easily or have sharp edges. Keep decorations that are small or have removable parts out of the reach of your child; as pieces can be harmful if swallowed.

Lights: Always turn off lights on trees and other decorations when you go to bed or leave your home. Never use electric lights on a metallic tree. Use only lights that have been tested by Underwriters Laboratories (UL label) or another reputable testing agency. Check each set of lights for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires or loose connections. Never use indoor lights outside. Keep children away from light sets and electrical decorations. Lights in windows can cause curtains and drapes to ignite. Outside cords should be approved for exterior uses and inside cords should not be placed under carpets or rugs.

Candles: Keep candles a safe distance from other items in your home and out of reach of children. Never use lighted candles on a tree or near other evergreens. Keep candles away from decorations and wrapping paper and place candles where they cannot be knocked over.

Paper: Dispose of gift wrappings. A room full of paper lying around on the floor is just one more holiday hazard. Do not burn wrappings in the fireplace.

Holiday Plants: Holly and mistletoe can be fatal to small child. Call 9-1-1 if your child ingests any of these plants.

Holiday Lights Reminders

Code Enforcement

Pursuant to Village Code 30-1(590.3B) holiday lights must be taken down within 90 days of the holiday. Christmas lights must be down by April 1st.

Christmas Tree Recycling

Christmas trees will be recycled throughout the Village on Friday, January 8th and Friday, January 15th. Place your Christmas tree in the parkway and follow these guidelines:

- Do not put trees in plastic bags.
- Remove the stand, decorations, lights, garland, tinsel, and metal (such as nails).
- Dispose wreaths in regular household garbage.
- Do not place artificial trees at the curb for recycling.
- Set your tree out on the above dates. If you miss the special collection dates, Allied Waste Services will collect Christmas trees with your regular garbage and refuse collection.

This service will be provided to the homeowners associations not regularly serviced by Allied Waste Services.

Sister Cities — Trip to Cape Coast

This August, a delegation of Sister Cities Committee members, including Chairperson, Linda McCance-Packham and Committee member Frank Grant-Acquah traveled to Hanover Park's Sister City of Cape Coast Ghana in West Africa. They met with the Omanhene (Paramount Chief) and members of the Oguua Traditional Council, the Metropolitan Chief Executive (Mayor) and the Regional Minister (the equivalent of a Governor).



They visited on-going projects at the Domestic Violence & Victim Support Unit at the Police HQ compound, the Children's Ward at the local hospital, and the namesake Hanover Park Primary School.

While the delegation was in town, the Mayor of Cape Coast joined the Sister Cities supporters and hospital medi-

cal staff at the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Playroom Annex to the Children's Ward. The Playroom is dedicated to the memory of the late Sonya Crawshaw, former Mayor of Hanover Park, who initiated the relationship with Cape Coast back in 1991.

All project funding and travel expenses were from private donations.

You will find Cape Coast on a map right along the Gulf of Guinea in the Atlantic Ocean. Sister Cities also has a second relationship with Valparaiso, Zacatecas, Mexico.

'Homes for a Changing Region' Study

The Village of Hanover Park, along with Glendale Heights and West Chicago, was awarded a grant from the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) to look at existing housing conditions, trends, supply and demand, and develop a long-term housing policy plan. The study is funded by CMAP at no cost to the communities.

So far, the selected firm of Teska & Associates has obtained feedback from local residential developers, realtors, property owners, and HOA managers, on current housing issues, and incorporated it in a Community Assessment Report, which is a 'snapshot' and observations of conditions in the community, along with an introduction of future opportunities.

Social Networking Safety

Kids love social networking! Websites and phone apps such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Tumblr and Snapchat allow users to interact with one another. Social networking is a great way to stay in touch with family and communicate with friends, but it can also be very dangerous. Many kids are sharing too much information online. Having instant access to strangers all over the world, coupled with the feeling of invulnerability that comes with adolescence, leaves children susceptible to all kinds of hazards.

Over sharing information can make your child vulnerable to identity theft and to internet predators. Social networking sites make it easy to pretend to be someone else. Child predators may hide behind a profile of a peer in order to gain trust and seduce your child. Location-based services expose a user's geographical location and give them the option to "tag" who they are with. Predators can use this tool to track your child's movements and determine when they are alone or not at home.

Teens don't often think of the long-range implications of what they post on social networking sites, which could lead them to make permanent mistakes. Posting inappropriate photos, making comments about other people and confessing personal secrets may come back to haunt them later. Teenagers use the internet to harass one another. When friends have a disagreement or when a relationship sours, many turn to the internet to seek revenge - something your child thought he or she was posting in confidence may suddenly be re-posted for all to see.

What children don't realize is that the internet is public domain and that they do not have the privacy or anonymity they think they do. As a parent, you can teach your children how to safely use social networking. Teach them not to post any personal identifying information online and to set their profile settings to "private" so that only people they invite can view their pages. Explain that online information and images live forever and they should not say anything online that they wouldn't feel comfortable saying face to face. Remind them that anyone can read what they post online, including teachers, potential college recruiters and employers. Tell your children not to give out their passwords to anyone, not even friends, because someone can post embarrassing or unsafe information on their personal pages or even pose as them to talk to other people. Make sure your children understand that not everyone they meet online is safe and they should NEVER arrange a personal meeting with someone that they met online. Treat your children's online activities like you do their offline ones. Ask questions about who their friends are, what they talk about, and if they have made any new friends.



Pay attention to changes in your child's behavior that might indicate he or she is having problems online; being secretive when using the computer, being overly happy or depressed when getting off the computer, or acting out in other ways like running away or engaging in risky behaviors with drugs or alcohol. Make sure they know your rules about internet usage and enforce appropriate consequences when they break the rules.

There are dangers in every part of our society. By educating your children to these dangers and taking appropriate steps to protect them, they can benefit from the social opportunities available online.
