Hanover Park Named to Neighborhood Scout's 100 Safest Cities List

We are proud to announce that Hanover Park has once again been selected to the 100 Safest Cities in America list compiled by Neighborhood Scout. The 2016 list places the Village at #56. Neighborhood Scout's research reveals the 100 safest cities in America with 25,000 or more people, based on the total number of property and violent crimes per 1,000 residents. Data used for this research are 1) the number of total crimes reported to the FBI to have occurred in each city, and 2) the population of each city.



We recognize that in addition to the hard work of our Police Officers, our partnerships within the community play a key role in keeping Hanover Park safe. We will continue to broaden and strengthen our outreach efforts to ensure that we are working with the community to identify and solve problems. Minute with the Mayor

My recent trip to the nation’s capital brought me in touch with over 300 mayors from across the country. Mayors were invited to the White House to have a dialogue with President Obama. As he enters his last year, his demeanor was casual and open. Nationally, he stated the rise in poverty is having an impact on education and the need to restore trust in policing is of great concern.

The Illinois delegation of 19 mayors was invited by Senator Durbin for lunch to confer on the concerns of Mayors. It was nice to see Senator Mark Kirk join us in Senator Durbin’s Capitol Hill office. The discussion centered on the hardships municipalities are facing due to a lack of a State Budget, which impacts delivery of services to our residents. The Village is not responsible for the character, products, or methods of any solicitor. As a consumer you have the responsibility to thoroughly review the contract or policies regarding the product, service, etc. being presented by the solicitor. Solicitors are not to door knock or disturb persons in their residences between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.



Internet Safe Trade Zone

We are pleased to advise residents that the Police Department is a designated **Internet Safe Trade Zone**. With the rise in online trading in which buyer and seller must meet to complete private transactions, the safety of those involved is a primary concern. Risks can include theft, robberies, and physical threats or harm. Residents seeking a safe place to conduct these transactions are free to utilize the parking lot and/or lobby of the Police Headquarters building on a 24/7 basis.

Please be aware that police personnel may not become actively involved in any transactions unless criminal activity is involved, and will not participate in the exchange of cash or the storing or transferring of items. Also, transactions related to weapons will not be allowed. Large items such as lawn mowers, snow blowers, or machines utilizing gasoline or other hazardous materials are prohibited from being brought into the lobby.



This pictured sign has been placed in the front parking lot of the Police Department Headquarters building to serve as a reminder of this option. We strongly encourage residents to take advantage of this safe way to conduct transactions.

Curfew Ordinance Reminder

The Hanover Park Police Department vigorously enforces the curfew ordinance ,66-71(b)(1) in an effort to reduce crime. Experience has shown that in many cases, juveniles violating curfew are involved in the commission of other more serious crimes. In other cases, juveniles violating curfew are at greater risk to become a victim of a crime.



Hanover Park local ordinance provides that, "It shall be unlawful for a minor to be or remain in any public place or on the premises of any establishment within the village during curfew hours."

Curfew Hours in Hanover Park are now defined as **10:00 p.m.** on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday until **6:00 a.m.** of the following day; and **11:00 p.m.** on Friday and Saturday until **6:00 a.m.** on the following day.

Minor, for the purposes of the curfew ordinance, is defined as a person less than 17 years of age who has not been emancipated by a court order.

Annual Spring Hydrant Flushing

Beginning **Monday, May 2nd** and continuing through **Friday, May 13th**, the Village Water Division will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village. Flushing will occur between 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Signs will be posted in designated areas prior to flushing.

Residents should **not** wash laundry during the flushing hours, as rust staining of clothing may result. Residents with water softeners are encouraged to check the cycle time of their softeners so that the unit does not regenerate during this period.

Hydrants will be flushed by area according to the following schedule:

Cook County

- May 2,3,4** - South of Irving Park Rd., north of Lake St., west of Barrington Rd.
- May 5,6** - South of Irving Park Rd. east of Barrington Rd. (Hanover Highlands and Longmeadow South area)
- May 9,10,11,12** - North of Irving Park Road

DuPage County

- May 2,3,4,5** - South of DuPage County Line, North of Stearns Road
- May 6,9** - South of Stearns Road, North of Schick Road
- May 10,11,12,13** - South of Schick Road

ComEd Proposes New Transmission Line Poles Itasca to Hanover Park - "West Central Reliability Project"

ComEd is proposing construction of 140'-170' tall poles along the Elgin O'Hare Expressway (I-390) right-of-way with high voltage electric transmission lines to connect the Itasca substation to the Bartlett substation on County Farm Rd. in Hanover Park.

The Project intends to provide an alternative delivery pathway so that ComEd may restore power to customers more quickly. The poles are designed to carry 138 KV power lines in this phase and 345 KV lines in the future. The project requires approval by the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) following a legal proceeding that is open to the public. ComEd expects to file a request for approval with the ICC in winter 2016. ComEd held public open houses in January to inform residents and potential stakeholders about the project. Elected officials and Village staff have been working with neighboring communities to collectively show concern regarding the potential impact to property values, enjoyment of property by existing owners, and aesthetics. Road Construction Update



Due to constraints with funding from the State of Illinois' Motor Fuel Tax in 2015, the street program for last year was postponed. Thankfully, the funds have been restored and the program for 2016 is being bid in the late winter of 2016 and is planned for early season construction.

The program will include the repaving and partial reconstruction of Celebrity Circle, with patching and spot improvements in other areas of the Village. We apologize in advance for any disruption while the construction is underway, but you should be pleased with the end result.

Tree Planting


In 2015 the Village was proud to announce that all Village owned Ash Trees designated for removal were removed. The Village Board authorized \$180,000 for tree planting in 2016. Bids were opened in January with very favorable results. The Village had planned on planting approximately 500 trees, but with favorable bids as many as 615 appear possible.

Prices for 36 different species of trees were received. It is important that we create a diverse urban forest to limit the impact that any future blight will have on the whole of the Village. The tree planting for 2016 will be split roughly even between a spring and a fall planting. If your parkway tree was removed as part of the Emerald Ash Borer removal program, and you are concerned about when it will be replaced, please call the Public Works Department Forestry Division at 630.823.5700.



2016 Brush Pick Up Program

The Brush Pick Up Program provides **FREE** curbside pickup and chipping of branches, which are then reused as mulch. Last year, the program produced mulch, which was made available free to Village residents for use around shrubs and flower beds. Brush will be picked up in April, July, and October.



What will be picked up: Branches with a minimum of two (2) feet in length and a maximum of ten (10) feet in length and less than eight (8) inches in diameter.

What will not be picked up: Small hedge or pine clippings; Yard waste or brush in containers; Brush or branches with thorns; Stumps or tree roots.

How to stack brush: Neatly stack the brush in one direction with the butt end toward the street; No lumber, wire, rope or other material may be included with the brush; Do not block the sidewalk when putting brush out.

Set Out Time: Brush can only be set out two days prior to 7:00 a.m. of your scheduled pick up period. Do not put brush out after 7:00 a.m. on the first day of the collection cycle. Hold it for the next scheduled pick up. The Village incurs considerable cost returning to an area to collect brush set out after the first day of the collection cycle.

Wood chip mulch is available for pick up or delivery. If interested, please contact Public Works at 630.823.5700 for further information or request a delivery.

Curbside yard waste collection is provided by Allied Waste Services once a week on Fridays beginning April 8, 2016 through December 2, 2016.

Yard waste stickers are required for curbside pickup, and yard waste must be placed in Kraft paper bags or branches must be tied in bundles up to 48 inches long and up to 18 inches in diameter.

Hanover Park Water and Sewer Billing Information

Residents must sign up for water service before moving into a residence. All residents moving must notify the Village of their moving date and forwarding address prior to their move.

Starting in **March 2016**, water bills will be issued on the **1st** day of the month, with payment due on the **21st** day of the month. If payment is not received by the initial due date a late charge equal to **10%** will be added to the balance.

Failure to receive a bill does not excuse the penalty charge.

If a bill remains unpaid, after the **34th day**, a **\$50.00** fee will be added and the service will be inactivated without further notice. **Payment of all outstanding account charges is required prior to restoring service.** Payments received **after 3:00 p.m. may result in up to 24 hours to have the service reinstated.**

Option for after-hours water turn on is available for \$100.00 fee.

There must be someone age 18 or older in the residence for water to be turned on or a waiver must be signed by the property owner.

A fee of \$50.00 will be charged for no show to appointments, water reactivation and/or water turn on.

Water usage is billed at **\$9.35** for each 1,000 gallons used. In addition, there is a **\$12.50** monthly service charge for infrastructure maintenance.

Sewer charges vary, depending on whether the address is located in Cook County or DuPage County. Cook County residents pay a sewer charge to the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District on their property tax bills, while DuPage County residents submit their total payment to the Village who provides the service.

Cook County residents are billed **\$2.07** for each 1,000 gallons of water used.

DuPage County residents are charged **\$5.57** for each 1,000 gallons of water used.
