Senior Housing Proposed at 900 Irving Park Road

Aman Living, LLC has purchased the 11-acre site, and is proposing construction of a senior housing development, which calls for age-restricted ranch-style and two-story townhomes, condos, assisted living units, memory care units, and a retail pad.

This Fall, you will see construction activity on the site related to the removal of the parking lot and mass grading. Asphalt will be mulched and stored on site during the winter to be spread as sub-base for streets, as weather permits, in late-winter/early spring. This is an environmentally-friendly option rather than it being sent to a land-fill. Preparing the site this Fall will enable the project to move forward efficiently in Spring, following Village approval.

While a development proposal was presented to the Development Commission in May 2016, the developer intends to present the plan with some modifications this winter through a Public Hearing process.



Police Department



“BB” and Pellet Gun Ordinance

Reminder to residents and their guests that it is unlawful for any person to carry or possess any loaded or uncased “Air Rifle” within the corporate limits.



Section 66-18 of the village’s local ordinance defines “Air Rifle” as “any air gun, air pistol, spring gun, spring pistol, BB gun, pellet gun or any implement that is not a firearm which shoots a pellet constructed of hard plastic, steel, lead or other hard materials with a force that reasonably is expected to cause bodily harm.

It is also unlawful to discharge any air rifle from or across any street, sidewalk, road, highway, or public land or any public place except on a safely constructed target range.

You may keep a BB gun or an air rifle within the confines of your home or other private enclosure. If you use the BB gun on your property it must be used in such a manner as to not endanger persons or property and the projectile must not be able to pass over any grounds or space outside the limits of such grounds or property.

Winter Parking Regulations Ordinance #62-11-1323

NO PARKING on Village streets after TWO inch snowfall Limited parking for snow removal. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village at any time within 24 hours after a snowfall of two inches or more has occurred, except on those streets where late night parking is permitted in Section 62-11-1327(b), that within 24 hours after a snowfall of two or more inches vehicles shall be parked only on the side of the street on the day during which late night parking is permitted.



Overnight Parking Program Ordinance #62-11-1327(a)

With holiday parties and visiting relatives, you may need to park a vehicle on the street between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. To get permission, you will need access to the internet and a valid email address.

Visit our website at www.hpil.org, and under the Community Services section on the home screen, click on Night Parking.



Complete the online form and submit your request. **Requests must be received prior to the 2:00 a.m. cutoff time.**

A confirmation of your request will be sent to the email address you provided. You will need this just in case a ticket is issued in error. Night Parking permission is given four times every thirty days per household.

“I call 911 from my cell phone in Hanover Park but I don’t always get a dispatcher for Hanover Park Police or Fire?”



When you call 911 from a mobile phone, the call often lands in a regional center. A call-taker in a far-away city or county may answer. To get help to you, there are two pieces of information the call-taker needs to know immediately:

1. Tell the call-taker which city you're calling from.
2. Tell the call-taker what type of emergency you have (police, fire or ambulance).

Different emergency services use different dispatch centers. With the right information, the call-taker will transfer you to the right center.

Program the alternative 911 emergency number for Hanover Park Police/Fire Dispatch 630.289.9111. This number will go directly to DUCOMM, the dispatching organization for Hanover Park.

Getting a Fresh Start

Not too long ago I had a garage sale and was *shocked* by the amount of things that I pulled out of my home. How had I accumulated so much stuff? Hanover Park Fire Department to Participate in FEMA Funded Research

The Hanover Park Fire Department has been notified that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has approved the Assistance to Firefighter’s grant application submitted in partnership with Skidmore College, University of Illinois, University of California at Los Angeles, Biomedical Modeling Division of U.S. Army Research, Globe Manufacturing, Zephyr Corporation, National Fallen Firefighters Foundation, International Association of Fire Fighters and Hanover Park Fire Department.

The grant, which will be administered by Dr. Denise Smith of Skidmore College and the University of Illinois, is for 1.5 million dollars and will be used to fund research testing of WASP™ (Wearable Advanced Sensor Platform) technologies for firefighters. The WASP™ system will be issued to all Hanover Park firefighters who will be required to wear the devices at all times when on-duty or participating in training. The WASP™ system will provide real time physiologic monitoring and tracking of firefighter vitals, core body temperature and 3-lead EKG while performing their duties and while on standby at the station including during downtime and sleep. Firefighters will wear these devices for a 12-month period, which will likely include several system upgrades as engineers at UCLA improve the technology based on findings discovered through usage. Hanover Park will be the only fire department participating in this national study.

Fire Chief Craig Haigh stated “I am extremely excited about this new round of research and want to thank Brian Chmielak, President of Local 3452 of the IAFF, for his support and leadership.” President Chmielak, along with Chief Haigh, jointly signed the commitment letter submitted on behalf of the Department indicating a willingness to participate in the project. A kickoff meeting with all the stakeholders will be scheduled in the coming weeks.



The “**Keep the Wreath Red**” program is an annual event aimed at increasing the awareness of fire safety while decorating our homes for the holidays. If a fire occurs that is determined to be the result of a holiday decoration, a white bulb replaces a **red** bulb on the **wreath**.

National Fallen Firefighters Memorial



Annette Ayala and Cindy Jennings, both volunteer members of the Hanover Park Fire Department -- Fire Corps had the honor of laying wreaths on the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial as part of the National 9-11 Memorial Service held September 11th. The Fallen Firefighters Memorial is located on the campus of the National Emergency Training Center/National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Both women were attending classes at the academy when they were offered the honor of participating in the ceremony.

The department’s Fire Corps response team provides firefighter rehab at fires and major incidents in both the Village and several neighboring communities. Firefighter rehab is a program designed to mitigate the detrimental impact of heat stress on the firefighters by providing them hydration, nourishment, core body cooling and medical monitoring. The program has been hugely successful in helping to reduce firefighter injuries and health related concerns.

Public Works

2016 Construction Projects:

The Village has had a busy construction season.

The big job for the year was the reconstruction/resurfacing of Celebrity Circle. Nearly 2,000 lineal feet of road was reconstructed and another 1,500 lineal feet was resurfaced. In addition, accessibility improvements were completed at each intersection and new storm sewer was added. It was a big job, but also a very big improvement.



The Village also completed storm sewer installations on Windsor Lane and Jefferson Street. Both of these were chronic wintertime icing problems where the initial design of the storm sewer might have worked when constructed, but after 20+ years of settlement in the neighborhood and the addition of impervious surface, more water was being sent to the curb line and it just couldn't handle the flow. Instead that water would sit in the curb and freeze in the winter. Both of these improvements were long needed and the Village was very happy to be a part of the solution.



Lastly, in an aging community, it becomes important to replace infrastructure as it begins to fail. While we can never do as much as we would like, the Village replaced 775 feet of twelve inch water main on Woodlake Drive. This was an area with regular water main breaks and it was exciting to be able to put in new pipe to keep the breaks from interrupting the residents' lives.

HOW TO PROTECT OUR WATERWAYS IN FALL & WINTER



Fall is a time for football, cooler days and changing leaves.

However, with the fall season also comes the need for yard cleanup. In autumn, leaves are often blown or swept into storm drains and waterways and can become a source of water pollution. Once they reach waterways, leaves decompose and release phosphorus into the water, which can result in algae blooms and decreased oxygen for fish.

gutters and storm drains, which can lead to localized flooding.

- Composted leaves mixed with other organic materials provide nutrients necessary for fertilizing lawns.
- Leaves can be chopped down into small pieces and used as mulch.
- Utilize a bagged leaf (securely sealed) collection or removal service.

However, pollutants are not the only problem. Leaves can also build up along curbs,

No Yard Waste Sticker Required For Leaf Collection in November



As a benefit to the residents of Hanover Park, leaf collection in November will not require a yard waste sticker to be collected by Republic Services/Allied Waste. This is during the month of **NOVEMBER ONLY**. Leaf collection in all other months will occur as it has previously. All you have to do is rake your leaves, put them into a recyclable yard waste bag, and set them at the curb on your normal trash pickup day. Christmas Tree Recycling

Christmas trees will be recycled throughout the Village on **Saturday, January 7th** and **Friday, January 13th**. Place your Christmas tree in the parkway and follow these guidelines:

- Do not put trees in plastic bags.
- Remove the stand and all decorations including lights, garland, tinsel, and metal (such as nails).
- Dispose of artificial or natural wreaths in the regular household garbage.
- Do not place artificial trees at the curb for recycling.

Set your tree out on the above dates. However, if you miss the special collection dates, Allied Waste Services will collect Christmas trees along with your regular garbage and refuse collection. This service will be provided to the homeowners associations not regularly serviced by Allied Waste Services.

“Silver Search Program”

Illinois has joined at least 42 other states in an alert system to help find missing and endangered subjects, such as Alzheimer's patients, who wander away from their homes or care facilities. SB 1846 established the “Silver Search Program” as part of the Endangered Missing Person Advisory to alert those in a community that a person with Alzheimer’s disease or other dementia-like cognitive impairment is reported missing. The

Silver Search Task Force will work with state departments, law enforcement, nursing homes, and senior centers to implement a community outreach program, perform training, and raise awareness of the Silver Search Alert. Similar to the AMBER ALERT, when a subject is reported missing, efforts will include the use of electronic signs and billboards, the media, and reverse 9-1-1 to send out the information.
